Career Notes

- Picks up his 11th PGA TOUR victory in his 265th start at the age of 32 years, 10 months, 11 days
- PGA TOUR wins (11): 2014 Memorial Tournament presented by Workday, 2016 WM Phoenix Open, 2016 WGC-HSBC Champions, 2017 WM Phoenix Open, 2017 WGC-Bridgestone Invitational, 2021 Masters Tournament, 2021 Baycurrent Championship, 2022 Sony Open in Hawaii, 2024 Genesis Invitational, 2024 FedEx St. Jude Championship, 2025 Sentry
- Most wins by an Asian player on the PGA TOUR: Hideki Matsuyama (11, Japan), K.J. Choi (8, South Korea)
- With wins at the 2022 Sony Open in Hawaii and 2025 Sentry, becomes the seventh player to win both Hawaii events during their career, joining Jim Furyk (1996 Sony, 2001 Sentry), Ernie Els (2003 Sentry, 2003 and 2004 Sony), Vijay Singh (2005 Sony, 2007 Sentry), Zach Johnson (2009 Sony, 2014 Sentry), Justin Thomas (2017 and 2020 Sentry, 2017 Sony) and Cameron Smith (2020 Sony, 2022 Sentry)
- Collects 700 points and moves to No. 1 in the FedExCup standings; finished the 2024 season No. 9 in the FedExCup and currently has 11 consecutive finishes inside the top 50 in the FedExCup, the longest active streak on TOUR
- Moves to No. 5 in the Official World Golf Ranking
- 5-for-8 in converting the 54-hole lead/co-lead to victory, including his last four attempts (2016 WGC-HSBC Champions, 2021 Masters Tournament, 2021 Baycurrent Championship, 2024 FedEx St. Jude Championship, 2025 Sentry)
- 257 equals his lowest 72-hole total on TOUR (257; 2022 Sony Open in Hawaii/Won)
- Bogey on the par-4 seventh during the final round snapped a personal-best streak of 47 consecutive bogey-free holes **PGA TOUR Records**
- Lowest score in relation to par in a 72-hole event (since the start of the 1983 season): 35-under (Hideki Matsuyama/2025 Sentry), 34-under (Cameron Smith/2022 Sentry), 33-under (Jon Rahm/2022 Sentry)
- Most birdies or better in a 72-hole event (since 1983): 35 (Hideki Matsuyama/2025 Sentry), 34 (Sungjae Im/2024 Sentry, Cameron Smith/2022 Sentry)

The Sentry Notes

- At 257, sets the tournament scoring record (258/Cameron Smith/2022)
- At 192, set the tournament 54-hole scoring record (193: Cameron Smith/2022, Jon Rahm/2022)

Miscellaneous Notes

- Six-time PGA TOUR winner **Collin Morikawa** finishes runner-up for the 10th time in 122 starts; holds six top-seven finishes in as many appearances at The Sentry (T7/2020, T7/2021, T5/2022, 2/2023, T5/2024, 2/2025)
- Sungjae Im (3rd) plays his last 51 holes without a bogey; records third top-5 finish in five starts at the event (T5/2021, T5/2024, 3/2025)
- Taylor Pendrith (T13) had an albatross on the par-5 fifth hole with a 6-iron from 203 yards, marking the first at The Sentry since the event moved to Kapalua in 1999; marks the 142nd on TOUR and first since Nick Hardy at the 2024 Butterfield Bermuda Championship (R2/No. 17)
- Chris Kirk finishes T44; Geoff Ogilvy (2010) is the most recent player to successfully defend his title at The Sentry
- Davis Riley WD during the final round
