Tom Hoge (1st/-9)

- Opens the 2025 PGA TOUR Season with a 9-under 64 to take a one-stroke lead over Will Zalatoris and Hideki Matsuyama
- Is the eighth player to open The Sentry with a round of 9-under or better since the event moved to Maui in 1999, with two of the previous seven going on to win (Ernie Els/2003, Jon Rahm/2023)
- Round included 10 birdies, equaling a career-high from the third round of the 2023 PLAYERS Championship (62)
- Equals his best round at the event (R4/2023) in three starts (T3/2023, T38/2024)
- Holds the first-round lead/co-lead for the 10th time on TOUR (1-for-9 to date; 2022 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am)
- Finished No. 29 in the FedExCup standings last season, advancing to the TOUR Championship for the second time (2022)
- In search of his second PGA TOUR victory in his 287th start (2022 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am)

Miscellaneous Notes

- **Will Zalatoris** (T2/-8) trails by one after posting his second-consecutive 65 at The Sentry; in his debut appearance at the 2023 Sentry, finished T11 with rounds of 69-69-65
- 10-time PGA TOUR winner **Hideki Matsuyama** (T2/-8) opens the season with a 65, equaling his best score in 29 rounds at The Sentry (R2/2022); marks the first time in eight career starts at The Sentry to sit inside the top-5 on the leaderboard after the first round
- Collin Morikawa (T4/-7) posts a bogey-free 66; his nine bogey-free rounds at The Sentry since 2021 are the most of any player
- Of the 18 players in the field making their debut appearance at The Sentry, Thomas Detry (T7/-6) got off to the best start with a 67
- Patton Kizzire (T23/-3) was the only player in the field with two eagles in the first round (Nos. 5, 18); marks his fourth round with multiple eagles in 751 rounds on the PGA TOUR
- Defending champion **Chris Kirk** (T48/+1) opens with a 74 in bid to become the first player to successfully defend his title at The Sentry since Geoff Ogilvy in 2010
