Hideki Matsuyama (1st/-16)

- Opened with back-to-back 8-under 65s to equal his second-lowest 36-hole score on TOUR; falls one shy of career-best 129 he opened with en route to victory at the 2024 FedEx St. Jude Championship
- Holds 36-hole lead/co-lead for the seventh time on TOUR (3-for-6 to date; 2016 WGC-HSBC Champions, 2021 Baycurrent Championship, 2024 FedEx St. Jude Championship)
- Leads the field in Strokes Gained: Tee to Green (6.312)
- In search of his 11th PGA TOUR victory in his 265th start (2014 Memorial Tournament presented by Workday, 2016 WM Phoenix Open, 2016 WGC-HSBC Champions, 2017 WM Phoenix Open, 2017 WGC-Bridgestone Invitational, 2021 Masters Tournament, 2021 Baycurrent Championship, 2022 Sony Open in Hawaii, 2024 Genesis Invitational, 2024 FedEx St. Jude Championship)

Collin Morikawa (2nd/-15)

- Closes a second-round 65 with five birdies in his final six holes (Nos. 13-17); one-shy of his career-best birdie streak, six birdies in a row on two occasions (most recently: R1/2024 TOUR Championship)
- Marks eighth round of 65 or better at The Sentry since 2020, most of any player
- Holds five top-seven finishes in as many appearances at The Sentry (T7/2020; T7/2021; T5/2022; 2/2023; T5/2024)
- Seeks seventh career TOUR title and first since 2023 Baycurrent Championship

Miscellaneous Notes

- **Thomas Detry** (T3) played Nos. 13-17 in 6-under (B-E-B-B-B), setting a new personal-best birdie-eagle streak; his previous-best streak was 3-under (two occasions; most recently in R1/2024 Genesis Scottish Open); one of three players inside the top 10 who are making their debut at The Sentry (**Maverick McNealy**/T3, **Harry Hall**/T7)
- Austrian **Sepp Straka** (11th) posts a second-round 65 at The Sentry, including a career-best seven consecutive birdies on Nos. 10-16; previously had five birdies in a row on two occasions (most recently: R1/2023 Masters/Nos. 12-16); ties longest birdie streak in a round at The Sentry during the Shotlink era (since 2003)
