**Scottie Scheffler**

- World No. 1 and reigning FedExCup Champion seeks to become first back-to-back winner of the FedExCup
- Enters the TOUR Championship No. 1 in the FedExCup standings for the fourth consecutive year
- With a win, would join Tiger Woods (2007, 2009) and Rory McIlroy (2016, 2019, 2022) as the only players to win multiple FedExCup titles
- Finished inside the top 25 in all 18 starts this season, with a season-high 15 top-10 finishes (including 13 straight entering the TOUR Championship); last finish outside the top 10 was THE PLAYERS Championship (T20)
- Leads all players with five wins this season: THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson, PGA Championship, the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday, The Open Championship, BMW Championship
- Following his win at last week's BMW Championship, became the first player since Tiger Woods (2005-07) to record five or more wins in back-to-back seasons; one of 18 players to win multiple FedExCup Playoffs events (2024 TOUR Championship, 2025 BMW Championship)
- Finishes in five prior starts in the TOUR Championship: 2024/Won, 2023/T6, 2022/T2, 2021/T22, 2020/5<sup>th</sup>

**Rory McIlroy**

- Only three-time winner of the FedExCup (2016, 2019, 2022) enters the week No. 2 in the FedExCup standings
- Marks his eighth consecutive season advancing to the TOUR Championship, the longest active streak by any player (previous: 8/Xander Schauffele, Tony Finau/2017-2024)
- In 15 starts on TOUR this season, recorded eight top-10 finishes and three wins (AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, THE PLAYERS Championship, Masters Tournament)
- Became the sixth player to complete the Career Grand Slam when he claimed the Masters Tournament this season
- Eight consecutive seasons with a win is the longest active streak on TOUR
- Finishes in 11 prior starts in the TOUR Championship: 2024/T9, 2023/4<sup>th</sup>, 2022/Won, 2021/T14, 2020/T8, 2019/Won, 2018/T7, 2016/Won, 2015/T16, 2014/T2, 2012/T10

**J.J. Spaun**

- Enters the week No. 3 in the FedExCup standings, making his TOUR Championship debut in his ninth season
- Qualified for the Playoffs for the sixth time in his career (2017, 2018, 2019, 2022, 2023, 2025)
- Recorded six top-10 finishes in 22 starts this season, highlighted by a win at the U.S. Open, his first win on TOUR since the 2022 Valero Texas Open

- Five top-three finishes this season are the second most by any player (Scottie Scheffler/7): T3/Sony Open in Hawaii, T2/Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches, P2/THE PLAYERS Championship, Won/U.S. Open, P2/FedEx St. Jude Championship
- Following his runner-up finish at the FedEx St. Jude Championship, became one of three players to secure an automatic qualification for the U.S. Team in the 2025 Ryder Cup (others: Scottie Scheffler, Xander Schauffele)
- Prior to this year, best career finish in the FedExCup was 34<sup>th</sup> (2021-22)

#### Justin Thomas

- 2017 FedExCup champion making his ninth career appearance in the TOUR Championship
- Captured his 16<sup>th</sup> win on TOUR in his 250<sup>th</sup> career start at the 2025 RBC Heritage
- In 19 starts this season, recorded seven top-10s, including one win and three runner-up finishes (2<sup>nd</sup>/The American Express, 2<sup>nd</sup>/Valspar Championship, T2/Truist Championship)
- Four of his seven top-10 finishes this year came in Signature Events: T9/The Genesis Invitational, Won/RBC Heritage, T2/Truist Championship, T9/Travelers Championship
- Finishes in eight prior starts in the TOUR Championship: 2024/T14, 2022/T5, 2021/4<sup>th</sup>, 2020/T2, 2019/T3, 2018/T7, 2017/2<sup>nd</sup>, 2016/T6

#### Tommy Fleetwood

- Enters the week No. 5 in the FedExCup standings, the highest-ranked player in the FedExCup without a win this season
- Finished T4 and T3 in the first two Playoffs events, respectively
- Fifth TOUR Championship appearance and his third consecutive (best finish: T6/2023)
- Seven top-10s this season are his second-highest total on TOUR since 2017-18 (9/2023)
- One of two players in the field without a victory on the PGA TOUR (other: Jacob Bridgeman)

#### Harris English

- Making his fourth career TOUR Championship appearance and first since 2021
- Four top-10s in 20 starts this season, including his fifth career PGA TOUR title at the Farmers Insurance Open, runner-up finishes at the PGA Championship and The Open Championship, and a T4 at the Travelers Championship
- Best career finish in the FedExCup: 12<sup>th</sup>/2019-20

#### TOUR Championship notes:

- Beginning this year, Starting Strokes will be eliminated as the TOUR Championship will be played as a 72-hole stroke-play event, with all players starting the tournament at even par and the winner claiming the FedExCup.
- The \$40 million purse at the TOUR Championship (\$10 million to the winner) will count as Official Money for the first time since 2018
- Six past FedExCup Champions are in the field: **Scottie Scheffler** (2024), **Viktor Hovland** (2023), **Rory McIlroy** (2016, 2019, 2022), **Patrick Cantlay** (2021), **Justin Rose** (2018), **Justin Thomas** (2017); three former FedExCup Champions enter the week inside the top five in the FedExCup standings (No. 1/**Scottie Scheffler**, No. 2/**Rory McIlroy**, No. 4/**Justin Rose**)
- Seven players are making their TOUR Championship debut this week:
  - **J.J. Spaun** (No. 3), **Ben Griffin** (No. 7), **Maverick McNealy** (No. 10), **Andrew Novak** (No. 15), **Harry Hall** (No. 26), **Jacob Bridgeman** (No. 27), **Chris Gotterup** (No. 29)
- 2018 FedExCup Champion **Justin Rose** entered the playoffs ranked 25<sup>th</sup> in the standings and now sits No. 4 following a win at the FedEx St. Jude Championship and T30 at the BMW Championship
- **Cameron Young** is making his second TOUR Championship appearance (2022/19<sup>th</sup>); claimed his maiden victory on TOUR at the 2025 Wyndham Championship, becoming the 1,000<sup>th</sup> unique winner in PGA TOUR history
- **Hideki Matsuyama** is making his 11<sup>th</sup> start in the TOUR Championship where he owns a pair of top-five finishes (2018/T4, 2016/5<sup>th</sup>)

#### FedExCup Playoffs:

- Despite not winning an event this season, eight players earned a two-year exemption on TOUR (thru 2027 season) by advancing to the TOUR Championship: **Tommy Fleetwood** (No. 5), **Maverick McNealy** (No. 10), **Corey Connors** (No. 19), **Shane Lowry** (No. 24), **Harry Hall** (No. 26), **Jacob Bridgeman** (No. 27), **Sungjae Im** (No. 28), **Akshay Bhatia** (No. 30)
- Three players in the field finished inside the top 10 in each of the first two FedExCup Playoffs events: **Scottie Scheffler** (T3-1<sup>st</sup>), **Tommy Fleetwood** (T4-T3), **Ludvig Åberg** (T9-T7).

- Of the 12 first-time winners in 2025, 10 qualified for the FedExCup Playoffs, with three advancing to the TOUR Championship: **Ben Griffin/Andrew Novak** (Zurich Classic of New Orleans), **Cameron Young** (Wyndham Championship)
- No 2025 rookies qualified for the TOUR Championship this season; of the 35 rookies on TOUR this season, South Africa's Aldrich Potgieter was the only one to qualify for the playoffs (No. 52 in the FedExCup standings)
- The FedExCup Bonus Distribution total is \$100 million, with the FedExCup Champion earning \$10 million
  - The top 70 players in the FedExCup standings are fully exempt for all Full-Field Events and THE PLAYERS Championship in 2026
  - The top 50 players are exempt for all Signature Events in 2026
  - The top 30 players receive a two-year exemption and invitations to majors that traditionally recognize the top 30
