Patrick Cantlay (T1/-16)

- Seventh career 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR (most recent: 2024 Genesis Invitational/finished T4); 3-for-6 converting to victory (2022 BMW Championship, 2021 TOUR Championship, 2021 BMW Championship)
- Seeks his ninth career PGA TOUR victory and first since the 2022 BMW Championship; three of his last four PGA TOUR titles have come in FedExCup Playoffs events: 2022 BMW Championship, 2021 TOUR Championship, 2021 BMW Championship
- 2021 FedExCup Champion seeks to become the third player with two or more FedExCup titles (Tiger Woods/2007, 2009; Rory McIlroy/2016, 2019, 2022)
- Posts his second 64 of the week; in 28 career rounds at East Lake Golf Club prior to this week, 65 marked his low score (R2/2018)
- Birdied Nos. 16-18 and is a combined 9-under on Nos. 16-18 through three rounds (7 birdies, 1 eagle)
- Has played the back nine in a combined 12-under, three strokes better than the next-lowest total (Russell Henley)
- Leads the field in Strokes Gained: Approach the Green (5.876) through three rounds
- Three top-five finishes in 18 starts this season (best: T4/Truist Championship); one of 12 players in the field without a win this season

Tommy Fleetwood (T1/-16)

- Fourth career 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR and third this season (most recent: 2025 FedEx St. Jude Championship/finished T3)
- One of three players this season with three or more 54-hole leads/co-leads:
 - Scottie Scheffler (4): THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson/Won, PGA Championship/Won, the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday/Won, The Open Championship/Won
 - Sepp Straka (3): The American Express/Won, AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am/T7, Truist Championship/Won
 - Tommy Fleetwood (3): Travelers Championship/T2, FedEx St. Jude Championship/T3, TOUR Championship/?
- Seeking his maiden PGA TOUR victory in his 164th career start; entered the week ranked No. 5 in the FedExCup standings, the highest-ranked player in the FedExCup without a win this season
- 30 top-five finishes are the most without a victory on TOUR since 1983
- One of two players in the field this week without a PGA TOUR victory (other: Jacob Bridgeman)
- Has sat T6 or better after the first 15 rounds in the FedExCup Playoffs
- Would become the first player in the FedExCup era (since 2007) to claim his first career PGA TOUR title at the TOUR Championship
- Would become the second player from England to win the FedExCup (Justin Rose/2018)
- The last seven winners of the TOUR Championship were all in the final pairing during the final round

Miscellaneous notes:

- 36-hole co-leader **Russell Henley** (3rd/-14) has come from behind in the final round in three of his five PGA TOUR victories (2025 Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard/1 stroke, 2017 Texas Children's Houston Open/4 strokes, 2014 Cognizant Classic/2 strokes); seeks his first multiple-win season
- After an even-par 70 in the opening round, U.S. Ryder Cup Captain **Keegan Bradley** (4th/-13) posts 64-63, with the latter the low round of the day; 63 ties his low 18-hole score of the season (R3/Travelers Championship/Won)
- Reigning FedExCup Champion **Scottie Scheffler** (5th/-12) posts 66 for his 20th consecutive round in the 60s, one shy of Patrick Cantlay's record of 21; trailed by four strokes through three rounds of last week's BMW Championship before going on to win; would become the first player (since 1983) to win on TOUR in consecutive weeks when trailing by four or more strokes entering the final round
- Scheffler seeks to become the first player to win back-to-back FedExCup titles and the third player to win multiple FedExCup titles (Tiger Woods/2007, 2009; Rory McIlroy/2016, 2019, 2022)
