AON SWING 5

The Aon Swing 5 for the Travelers Championship is made up of the top five players, not otherwise exempt, earning the most FedExCup points in the ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic, Charles Schwab Challenge and RBC Canadian Open.

Two players played their way into the Aon Swing 5 after the RBC Canadian Open: Kevin Yu and Harry Hall. Ryan Fox, who was in the Aon Swing 5 at the Memorial Tournament, won the RBC Canadian Open to move into the Aon Next 10.

TOP 50 RETENTION TRACKING

30 of the top 50 players in the 2024 FedExCup standings are in the top 50 of the current season's standings through the U.S. Open. At No. 5, Ben Griffin is the highest in the FedExCup standings among players that were outside the top 50 in 2024 (No. 57 in 2024).

For reference:

- » Through the 2024 U.S. Open, 31 of the top 50 players in the 2023 FedExCup standings were in the top 50 of the FedExCup standings.
- » 31 of the top 50 players in the 2023 FedExCup standings finished the 2024 season in the top 50 of the FedExCup standings.

ELIGIBILITY NOTES

Luke Clanton sponsor exemption

Luke Clanton, who earned his PGA TOUR card through PGA TOUR University Accelerated and made his first start as a member at the RBC Canadian Open, received one of the four sponsor exemptions, which are restricted to PGA TOUR members.

Clanton is the only player in the field making his first start in a Signature Event this season, bringing the total number of unique players to compete in Signature Events this season to 112 (2024: 115).

This is the third consecutive year that a player who recently joined the TOUR through PGA TOUR University has received a sponsor exemption to the Travelers Championship (Ludvig Åberg in 2023, Michael Thorbjørnsen in 2024).
