J.J. Spaun

- Earned his first major championship at last week's U.S. Open, his second win on TOUR in his 236th start (2022 Valero Texas Open)
- Became the first player on TOUR since 2003 to shoot in the 40s on the front nine of the final round and go on to win (40-32)
- 34-year-old became the first player since Webb Simpson (2012) to win the U.S. Open on his second attempt (MC in 2021/Torrey Pines South)
- Last to win a major and win on TOUR the following week: Scottie Scheffler (2024 Masters Tournament, 2024 RBC Heritage)
- With the win, moved from No. 25 to No. 8 in the Official World Golf Ranking and ranks No. 6 in the FedExCup standings
- Has four top-three finishes in 17 starts this season (T3/Sony Open in Hawaii, T2/Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches, P2/THE PLAYERS Championship, Won/U.S. Open)
- Set to make seventh start at the Travelers Championship (best: T30/2019)

Rory McIlroy

- World No. 2 has finished in the top-20 in five previous starts at the Travelers Championship (best: T7/2023)
- Has posted 64 or better in six of his 20 career rounds at TPC River Highlands (best: 62/R1/2022)
- First time in 41 years that a Career Grand Slam winner has played in the Travelers Championship; Gary Player, who claimed the Career Grand Slam in 1965, competed five times at the event after that, most recently in 1984, the first year the tournament was held at TPC River Highlands
- With wins at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, THE PLAYERS Championship and Masters Tournament, is one of five multiple winners this season (Scottie Scheffler/3, Ryan Fox/2, Ben Griffin/2, Sepp Straka/2)
- Fifth PGA TOUR season with three or more victories (2012/4, 2014/3, 2019/3, 2022/3, 2025/3)

Scottie Scheffler

- World No. 1, reigning FedExCup Champion and 16-time PGA TOUR winner in search of fourth victory of the season (THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson, PGA Championship, the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday)
- Posted 65 or better in all four rounds en route to victory in 2024 (65-64-64-65); 72-hole total of 258 is the second-lowest in tournament history (257/Keegan Bradley/2023)
- Defeated Tom Kim in a playoff to win the 2024 Travelers Championship and capture 12th PGA TOUR victory
- Owns two top-10 finishes in five career starts in the Travelers Championship (T4/2023, Won/2024)
- One of two players to win the Travelers Championship and the FedExCup in the same season (Dustin Johnson/2020)
- Seeks to become the first player since Phil Mickelson (2001-2002) to win consecutive Travelers Championship titles
- Ranks T54 on the all-time wins list, tied with five others (Jack Burke, Jr., Ralph Guldahl, Mark O'Meara, Justin Thomas, Tom Weiskopf)

Keegan Bradley

- 2023 Travelers Championship winner making his 15th career appearance; owns three top-10s (T8/2017, T2/2019, Won/2023)
- Holds or shares the 36- (125/with Denny McCarthy/2023), 54- (189) and 72-hole (257) tournament scoring records from his 2023 Travelers Championship victory
- Has four top-10 finishes in 14 starts this season (T6/Sony Open in Hawaii, T5/Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard, T8/PGA Championship, T7/the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday)
- Named 2025 U.S. Ryder Cup Team Captain and has played in two Ryder Cups (2012 and 2014); the 2025 Ryder Cup will
 be held at Bethpage Black in September, where he will be 39 at the time, making him the youngest Ryder Cup captain
 since 34-year-old Arnold Palmer was a playing captain in 1963

Ben Griffin

- Making third consecutive start at the Travelers Championship (MC/2023, 67th/2024)
- Two-time PGA TOUR winner, with both coming earlier this season: Zurich Classic of New Orleans (with partner Andrew Novak), Charles Schwab Challenge
- Owns eight top-10 finishes in 20 starts this season; enters the week with top-10s in each of his last four starts (T8/PGA Championship, Won/Charles Schwab Challenge, 2nd/the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday, T10/U.S. Open)
- Eight top-10s is the second-most of any player on TOUR this season (10/Scottie Scheffler)
- After finishing the 2024 season at No. 57 in the FedExCup Fall standings, qualified for six of the eight Signature Events this season and sits No. 1 in the Aon Next 10 standings

Jordan Spieth

- 2017 Travelers Championship is one of 13 PGA TOUR victories, which he claimed in his tournament debut; seeks his first TOUR title since the 2022 RBC Heritage
- Will make his seventh start at the Travelers Championship, with his win (2017) as his only top-10 finish
- 16th start of the season, with four top 10-finishes (T4/WM Phoenix Open, T9/Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches, 4th/THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson, T7/the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday)
- Enters the week No. 37 in the FedExCup standings; playing in the final year of his Tournament Winners exemption

Travelers Championship notes:

- At 6,835 yards, TPC River Highlands was the second shortest course on PGA TOUR in 2024 (Port Royal Golf Course/71/6,828 yards)
- TPC River Highlands holds two sub-60 rounds on the PGA TOUR: Jim Furyk (58/R4/2016), Cameron Young (59/R3/2024)
- The Travelers Championship is the last of eight Signature Events during the 2025 PGA TOUR Season; contested the week after the U.S. Open, 63 of the 72 players in this week's field competed at Oakmont Country Club
- Field includes 45 of the top 50 players in the Official World Golf Ranking, headlined by all in the top 10: World No. 1 Scottie Scheffler, No. 2 Rory McIlroy, No. 3 Xander Schauffele, No. 4 Collin Morikawa, No. 5 Justin Thomas, No. 6 Russell Henley, No. 7 Sepp Straka, No. 8 J.J. Spaun, No. 9 Viktor Hovland, No. 10 Ludvig Åberg
- Additional field features:
 - Five past champions: Jordan Spieth (2017), Harris English (2021), Xander Schauffele (2022), Keegan Bradley (2023), Scottie Scheffler (2024)
 - Six past FedExCup champions: Jordan Spieth (2015), Justin Thomas (2017), Rory McIlroy (2016/2019/2022),
 Patrick Cantlay (2021), Viktor Hovland (2023), Scottie Scheffler (2024)
- As a Signature Event, the tournament grants four sponsor exemptions to PGA TOUR members:
 - Luke Clanton: PGA TOUR rookie owns two top-25 finishes in six starts this season
 - Rickie Fowler: Four top-25s in seven career starts at the Travelers Championship (T13/2010, T13/2013, T13/2023, T20/2024)
 - o Tom Kim: Making third consecutive appearance in the Travelers Championship; T38/2023, P2/2024)
 - Gary Woodland: Four-time PGA TOUR winner making his seventh career start in the Travelers Championship with his best finish being a T20 in 2015
- Florida State standout **Luke Clanton** became the second player to earn PGA TOUR membership through PGA TOUR University Accelerated (Gordon Sargent) and made his professional debut earlier this month at the RBC Canadian Open (MC); recorded four top-10s and 10 made cuts in 13 PGA TOUR starts as an amateur, highlighted by runner-up finishes at the 2024 John Deere Classic and 2024 RSM Classic

PGA TOUR season notes

- With 3,726 FedExCup points, Scottie Scheffler has a 1,002-point lead over Rory McIlroy in the FedExCup Standings
- All Signature Event winners this season are in the field: Hideki Matsuyama (The Sentry), Rory McIlroy (AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am), Ludvig Åberg (The Genesis Invitational), Russell Henley (Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard), Justin Thomas (RBC Heritage), Sepp Straka (Truist Championship), Scottie Scheffler (the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday)
- Maverick McNealy enters the week at No. 8 in the FedExCup, the highest-ranked player without a win this season
- World No. 3 **Xander Schauffele** has 66 consecutive made cuts on TOUR, the longest active streak and sixth-longest streak in TOUR history (Tiger Woods/142, Byron Nelson/113, Jack Nicklaus/105, Hale Irwin/86, Dow Finsterwald/72)
- Eight first-time winners in 2025: Thomas Detry (WM Phoenix Open), Brian Campbell (Mexico Open at VidantaWorld),
 Joe Highsmith (Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches), Karl Vilips (Puerto Rico Open), Min Woo Lee (Texas Children's Houston Open), Ben Griffin/Andrew Novak (Zurich Classic of New Orleans), Ryan Fox (ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic)
