## Keegan Bradley (Won/-15)

- Wins eighth PGA TOUR title in 368<sup>th</sup> start at 39 years, 15 days with a birdie putt from 5 feet, 8 inches on the 72<sup>nd</sup> hole
- **PGA TOUR victories (8):** 2011 CJ CUP Byron Nelson, 2011 PGA Championship, 2012 WGC-Bridgestone Invitational, 2018 BMW Championship, 2022 Baycurrent Championship, 2023 Travelers Championship, 2024 BMW Championship, 2025 Travelers Championship
- Wins in back-to-back-to back seasons for the first time on TOUR
- 2023 Travelers Championship winner becomes eighth multiple-time winner of the event (first since Bubba Watson in 2018)
- Wins from three-or-more strokes behind entering the final round for the fourth time on TOUR (previous: 2018 BMW Championship/3 strokes)
- Earns 700 FedExCup Points and moves from No. 30 to No. 8 in the FedExCup standings
- Projected to move from No. 21 to No. 7 in the Official World Golf Ranking
- Four top-10 results in 15 appearances at Travelers Championship (2025/Won, 2023/Won, 2019/T2, 2017/T8)
- U.S. Ryder Cup Team Captain is projected to move inside the top 10 in the U.S. Ryder Cup team ranking after entering the week at No. 17

- Seven-time DP World Tour winner **Tommy Fleetwood** (T2/-14) bogeys two of his final three holes; has 42 top-10 finishes, the most of any player without a win on TOUR since 1983; four of his five top-10s this season have come in Signature Events (T5/The Genesis Invitational, 7<sup>th</sup>/RBC Heritage, T4/Truist Championship, T2/Travelers Championship); other: T4/Charles Schwab Challenge
- Russell Henley (T2/-14) chips in for birdie on the 72<sup>nd</sup> hole to record his best finish in eight appearances at the Travelers Championship (previous: T6/2018); posts four rounds in the 60s in a single event for the second time in 14 starts this season (Sony Open in Hawaii/T10)
- Harris English (T4/-13), who defeated Kramer Hickok in an 8-hole playoff to win the 2021 Travelers Championship, fires his fifth score of 65 or better in 43 rounds at TPC River Highlands
- **Jason Day** (T4/-13) posts best result in 10 appearances at Travelers Championship (previous: T8/2019); notches his best finish on TOUR since 2025 American Express (T3)
- World No. 1 and 2024 Travelers Championship winner Scottie Scheffler (T6/-12) posts his 70<sup>th</sup> top-10 on TOUR
- World No. 2 **Rory McIlroy** (T6/-12) has finished in the top-20 in each of his six starts at the Travelers Championship, recording his best result this week
