Friday Weather: Mostly cloudy. High of 85. Winds SW at 3-6 mph.

Friday Suspension of Play: Play was suspended on Friday due to lightning in the area at 8:15 p.m. ET with 13 players left to complete the second round.

Saturday Resumption of Play: Play resumed on Saturday at 7:30 a.m. and concluded at 7:56 a.m.

Saturday Morning Weather: Cloudy and rainy. High of 68. Winds WSW at 4 mph.

Saturday's Schedule: The third round will be played in twosomes off No. 1 with tee times from 9:12 a.m. to 3:35 p.m. **36-Hole Cut**: 66 professionals and one amateur at 7-over 147 from a field of 141 professionals and 15 amateurs.

Sam Burns (1st/-3)

- Cards the low score of the second round (65), beating the second-round field scoring average by 9.781 strokes
- Shoots his low 18-hole score in a U.S. Open (65); previous low: 67 (three times; 2024/Pinehurst No. 2/R4; 2024/Pinehurst No. 2/R2; 2022/The Country Club/R2)
- Posts his low 36-hole score in a major (137); previous low: 138 (two times; 2022 U.S. Open; 2022 PGA Championship)
- 3-under is the highest score-to-par for the 36-hole lead at the U.S. Open since 2013 (1-under/Phil Mickelson, Billy Horschel/Merion Golf Club)
- Eighth time leading/co-leading after the second round on TOUR (1-for-7); won the 2021 Valspar Championship
- First 36-hole lead/co-lead in a major; previous best position: T6 (2023 Masters Tournament)/finished T29
- 28-year-old seeks his sixth win in his 174th start on TOUR (2021 Valspar Championship; 2021 Sanderson Farms Championship; 2022 Valspar Championship; 2022 Charles Schwab Challenge; 2023 WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play)
- Seeks his first major title (best finish: T9/2024 U.S. Open); most recent first-time major winner: Xander Schauffele (2024 PGA Championship); most recent to win first major at the U.S. Open: Wyndham Clark (2023)
- Three top-10 finishes in 16 starts this season (T8/The Sentry; T5/THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson; P2/RBC Canadian Open)
- Looks to become the first player on TOUR to lose in a playoff (RBC Canadian Open/lost to Ryan Fox) and then win
 the next week since Andrew Novak (lost in a playoff at 2025 RBC Heritage, won 2025 Zurich Classic of New
 Orleans)
- One top-10 finish in six previous appearances at the U.S. Open (T9/2024/Pinehurst No. 2); MC at Oakmont Country Club in his U.S. Open debut in 2016 (74-75)
- In the first two majors of the 2025 season, he finished T46 (Masters Tournament) and T19 (PGA Championship)

J.J. Spaun (2nd/-2)

- 18-hole leader holds his best 36-hole position in a major (2nd); previous best position: T16 (2022 Masters Tournament)/finished T23
- Seeks his first major title (best finish: T23/2022 Masters Tournament)
- 34-year-old seeks his second win on TOUR in his 236th start (2022 Valero Texas Open)

- Four top-10 finishes in 16 starts in 2025 (T3/Sony Open in Hawaii; T2/Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches; P2/THE PLAYERS Championship; T6/Charles Schwab Challenge)
- In the first two majors of the 2025 season, he finished 50th (Masters Tournament) and T37 (PGA Championship)
- Second appearance in the U.S. Open; MC in 2021 at Torrey Pines (South) after shooting 77-75

Additional Notes

- Viktor Hovland (3rd/-1) cards 2-under 68, including an eagle-2 on No. 17; looks to become the first player from Norway to win a major; Valspar Championship winner looks to become the sixth multiple winner of the 2025 season (Scottie Scheffler/3; Rory McIlroy/3; Ryan Fox/2; Ben Griffin/2; Sepp Straka/2)
- Making his 96th consecutive major appearance (the longest active streak), Adam Scott (T4) posts even-par 70 for the second consecutive day; looks to become the third player from Australia to win the U.S. Open (David Graham/1981; Geoff Ogilvy/2006)
- Seeking his third win in seven starts, Ben Griffin (T4) sits at even-par; won the Zurich Classic of New Orleans (with partner Andrew Novak) and Charles Schwab Challenge; finished 2nd in his most recent start (the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday)
- **Victor Perez** (T6) makes a hole-in-one on No. 6; his first ace on the PGA TOUR; 16th ace of the 2025 season on TOUR; 54th ace in U.S. Open history
- World No. 1 and FedExCup leader **Scottie Scheffler** (T23/+4) cards 1-over 71; PGA Championship winner looks to become the first player since Jordan Spieth (2015 Masters Tournament; 2015 U.S. Open) to win consecutive majors
- **Xander Schauffele** (T45/+6) makes his 66th consecutive cut, the longest active streak on TOUR and sixth-longest streak in TOUR history (Tiger Woods/142; Byron Nelson/113; Jack Nicklaus/105; Hale Irwin/86; Dow Finsterwald/72); has finished in the top 14 in each of his eight appearances at the U.S. Open; best finish: T3/2019; his seven top-10s are the most of any player at the U.S. Open since 2017
- 2011 champion **Rory McIlroy** (T45/+6) birdies two of his last four holes (Nos. 15, 18) to make his seventh consecutive cut at the U.S. Open; has finished in the top 10 in each of the previous six (T9/2019; T8/2020; T7/2021; T5/2022; 2nd/2023; 2nd/2024)
- Zach Bauchou withdrew before Saturday's resumption of play
