Notable

- The practice facility was renovated since last year's event.
- Course sits on Edwards Aquifer Recharge Zone and works in partnership with the Edwards Aquifer Authority and San Antonio Water System to ensure an environmental plan that protects the aquifer that is the main source of water for the growing community.
- TPC San Antonio has one of the most stringent environmental management plans in the country and focuses on protection, sustainability and management for the environment.
- The facility's other course – Canyons – was designed by Pete Dye and hosted the PGA TOUR Champions' San Antonio Championship from 2011-15.
