Ben Griffin (Winner/-29)

- Earns his third PGA TOUR title in his 106th career start at the age of 29 years, 6 months, 3 days
- Becomes the seventh multiple winner on TOUR this season and joins Scottie Scheffler and Rory McIlroy as the only players with three or more victories this season (Scottie Scheffler/6, Rory McIlroy/3, Ben Griffin/3, Ryan Fox/2, Brian Campbell/2, Sepp Straka/2)
- Win marks first top-10 finish in four starts at the World Wide Technology Championship (previous best: T23/2023)
- 259 sets tournament low 72-hole score (previous: 261: 2023/Erik van Rooyen, 2022/Russell Henley, 2021/Viktor Hovland)
- Becomes third World Wide Technology ambassador to win the event (Austin Eckroat/2024, Erik van Rooyen/2023)
- In two years of the World Wide Technology Championship being held at El Cardonal at Diamante, the winner has carded a 63 in the final round: Ben Griffin/2025, Austin Eckroat/2024, Erik van Rooyen/2023
- Marks his 12th top-10 finish on TOUR this season, highlighted by three wins
- Earned first two victories on TOUR this season: 2025 Zurich Classic of New Orleans, 2025 Charles Schwab Challenge
- World No. 12 is the second-highest ranked player in the field behind J.J. Spaun (No. 6); moves to No. 9 in the Official World Golf Rankings, which would mark his career-best world ranking (previous best: No. 11)
- Moves to T339 in the all-time PGA TOUR wins list

Miscellaneous notes

- Making his third start at the event, **Chad Ramey** (T2/-27) records his best finish on TOUR this season (previous best: T5/Valero Texas Open); projected to move to No. 89 in the FedExCup Fall standings after entering the week at No. 123
- Finland's **Sami Valimaki** (T2/-27) records his second career runner-up finish (2024 Mexico Open at VidantaWorld) and best finish on TOUR this season (previous best: 4th/Texas Children's Houston Open); projected to move to No. 76 in the FedExCup Fall standings after entering the week at No. 103
- Two-time TOUR winner and 54-hole leader **Garrick Higgo** (T4/-26) was attempting to earn his second PGA TOUR victory this season and to become the second winner from South Africa in tournament history, joining Erik van Rooyen (2023); marks fifth top-10 finish on TOUR this season
- Trevor Cone (T4/-26) earns first top-10 finish on TOUR this season (previous best: T14/ISCO Championship)
- Two players from Mexico that made the cut: **Alejandro Madariaga** (T46/-14/Puebla), **Emilio Gonzalez** (T72/-6/San Miguel de Allende)

FedExCup Fall Notes

- The 2025 World Wide Technology Championship is the fifth event of the FedExCup Fall, a group of seven tournaments played after the TOUR Championship that finalizes eligibility for the 2026 PGA TOUR Season.
- The top 100 players in the FedExCup Fall standings at the conclusion of the FedExCup Fall at The RSM Classic will be exempt into all Full-Field Events and THE PLAYERS Championship in 2026 while Nos. 101-150 will have conditional status on TOUR.

- Players who moved inside the top 100 in the FedExCup Fall standings after the World Wide Technology Championship:
 - Sami Valimaki (T2/No. 103 to No. 76), Chad Ramey (T2/No. 123 to No. 89)
- Players who moved outside the top 100 in the FedExCup Fall standings after the World Wide Technology Championship:
 - Tom Kim (DNP/No. 96 to No. 102), Adam Scott (DNP/No. 100 to No. 103)
- The Aon Next 10 is an eligibility pathway that awards access into Signature Events (outside of The Sentry), recognizing the top 10 players, not otherwise exempt, from the FedExCup standings; Nos. 51-60 in the final FedExCup Fall standings at the conclusion of The RSM Classic will serve as the Aon Next 10 for the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am and The Genesis Invitational.
