Keegan Bradley Rickie Fowler

Keegan Bradley

- U.S. Ryder Cup Captain is making his fourth start at the Wyndham Championship (T46/2016, T42/2017, T22/2024)
- Has five top-10 finishes in 17 starts this season, winning the Travelers Championship for his eighth PGA TOUR victory
- Victories in back-to-back-to back seasons for the first time on TOUR
- No. 10 in the FedExCup standings

Rickie Fowler

- Making his fourth start at the Wyndham Championship (T22/2016, MC/2021, MC/2022)
- Finished T7 at the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday for his lone top-10 finish in 18 starts this season
- Top-20 finishes in two of his last three starts: John Deere Classic (T18), The Open Championship (T14), 3M Open (T28)
- Last of his six PGA TOUR wins came at the 2023 Rocket Classic
- No. 61 in the FedExCup standings

Ryan Gerard

- First-Year Member making his second start at the Wyndham Championship (MC/2023)
- Finished 12th in the 2024 Korn Ferry Tour Points List to earn his PGA TOUR card for 2025
- Has nine top-25 finishes in 23 starts this season, led by his first TOUR win in his most recent start at the Barracuda Championship and a runner-up finish at the Valero Texas Open
- Finished T8 at the PGA Championship at Quail Hollow Club in Charlotte
- One of 11 first-time winners this season is currently No. 29 in the FedExCup standings
- Raleigh, North Carolina native played five seasons at the University of North Carolina (2017-22), winning once individually
 and garnering 2022 All-America Second Team and All-Atlantic Coast Conference honors

Ben Griffin

- One of six multiple winners this season (Zurich Classic of New Orleans, Charles Schwab Challenge)
- Has eight top-10 finishes in 24 starts this season, including four consecutive (T8/PGA Championship, 1st/Charles Schwab Challenge, 2nd/the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday, T10/U.S. Open)
- Making his fourth start at the Wyndham Championship, with top-10 finishes in 2022 (4th) and 2024 (T7)
- Born and raised in Chapel Hill, North Carolina and played four seasons at the University of North Carolina (2014-18), where he won three individual tournament titles
- No. 7 in the FedExCup standings

Jackson Koivun

- No. 1-ranked player in the World Amateur Golf Ranking competing on a sponsor exemption
- Rising Auburn University junior became the third player to earn TOUR status through PGA TOUR University Accelerated
 (joining Vanderbilt's Gordon Sargent and Florida State's Luke Clanton) and will be eligible to take up PGA TOUR membership
 at the conclusion of his collegiate career
- First college player to sweep the Fred Haskins, Ben Hogan, Jack Nicklaus and Phil Mickelson national awards in the same season (2024)
- Making his eighth PGA TOUR start and sixth this season; has top-15 finishes in his last two starts (T11/John Deere Classic, T6/ISCO Championship)
- Making his debut appearance at the Wyndham Championship

Adam Scott

- Making his seventh start at the Wyndham Championship, with top-10 finishes in 2021 (T2) and 2023 (T7)
- Has five top-25 finishes in 16 starts this season (best: T12/U.S. Open); last top-10 in a standard stroke-play event came at the 2024 BMW Championship (T2)
- No. 85 in the FedExCup standings; needs a 2-way T3 finish or better to move inside the top 70
- Finished inside the top 30 in the 2024 FedExCup standings and is exempt on TOUR thru 2026

Jordan Spieth

- 13-time PGA TOUR winner in search of his first victory since the 2022 RBC Heritage
- Making his fifth start at the Wyndham Championship, with one top-10 finish (2nd/2013)
- Has four top-10 finishes in 17 starts this season, including THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson (4th) and WM Phoenix Open (T4)
- 2015 FedExCup Champion enters the week No. 50 in the FedExCup standings

Wyndham Championship notes

- Since the inception of the FedExCup in 2007, the Wyndham Championship has played host to the FedExCup Regular Season finale (since 2008 at Sedgefield Country Club)
- This year marks the 86th annual Wyndham Championship, having been included on the PGA TOUR schedule since 1938 (the seventh-longest running TOUR event excluding the majors)
- The Wyndham Championship winner will receive 500 FedExCup points, a two-year exemption on the PGA TOUR and \$1,476,000; the winner will also be exempt for The Sentry, THE PLAYERS Championship, Masters Tournament and PGA Championship in 2026
- The Wyndham Championship boasts its strongest field in the FedExCup era (since 2007), with 21 of the top 50 in the Official World Golf Ranking and 22 of the top 50 in the current FedExCup standings.
- Aaron Rai is seeking to become the first player to successfully defend at the event since Sam Snead in 1956
- **Kurt Kitayama**, winner of last week's 3M Open, seeks to become the first to win back-to-back tournaments since Scottie Scheffler (2024 Masters Tournament, RBC Heritage)
- David Ford, the No. 1 player in 2025 PGA TOUR University Ranking and University of North Carolina product, will make his Wyndham Championship debut as a sponsor exemption. Ford won the AJGA's 2020 Sedgefield Invitational at Sedgefield Country Club.
- Additional field highlights:
 - 21 of the top 50 in the Official World Golf Ranking are in the field, led by No. 7 Keegan Bradley, No. 12 Hideki Matsuyama, No. 14 Robert MacIntyre, No. 17 Ben Griffin
 - 69 of the top 100 in the FedExCup standings (and 22 of the top 50), led by No. 7 Ben Griffin and No. 10 Keegan Bradley
 - Two past FedExCup champions: Brandt Snedeker (2012), Jordan Spieth (2015)
 - 10 past champions (11 wins): Aaron Rai (2024), Lucas Glover (2023), Tom Kim (2022), Kevin Kisner (2021), Jim Herman (2020), J.T. Poston (2019), Brandt Snedeker (2007, 2018), Si Woo Kim (2016), Camilo Villegas (2014), Webb Simpson (2011)

- Sponsor exemptions: Zac Blair, David Ford, Will Gordon, Chesson Hadley, Zach Johnson, Jackson Koivun, Thriston Lawrence, Braden Thornberry
- Playing the 2025 season with conditional status, **Pierceson Coody** finishes T3 at the 3M Open to qualify for the Wyndham Championship; Coody is currently No. 7 in the Korn Ferry Tour Points List

Comcast Business TOUR TOP 10

- The Wyndham Championship also serves as the final opportunity for players to secure their spot inside the Comcast Business TOUR TOP 10, which rewards season-long performance for the top 10 players in the FedExCup standings at the conclusion of the FedExCup Regular Season
- The Comcast Business TOUR TOP 10 will share a \$40 million bonus, with the No. 1-ranked played earning \$8 million
- Two players in the field, **Ben Griffin** (No. 7) and **Keegan Bradley** (No. 10) will look to solidify their position in the top 10, while three players in the field can play their way into the Comcast Business TOUR TOP 10:
 - o Hideki Matsuyama (No. 23): Win
 - o Robert MacIntyre (No. 15): Solo 2nd or better
 - o Andrew Novak (No. 12): 5-way T3 or better

PGA TOUR season notes

- 29 of the top 50 players in the 2024 FedExCup standings are in the top 50 of the current season's standings through 3M Open. At No. 6, Harris English is the highest in the FedExCup standings among players that were outside the top 50 in 2024. For reference, 31 of the top 50 players in the 2023 FedExCup standings finished the 2024 season in the top 50 of the FedExCup standings.
- 11 first-time winners in 2025: Thomas Detry (WM Phoenix Open), Brian Campbell (Mexico Open at VidantaWorld), Joe Highsmith (Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches), Karl Vilips (Puerto Rico Open), Min Woo Lee (Texas Children's Houston Open), Ben Griffin/Andrew Novak (Zurich Classic of New Orleans), Ryan Fox (ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic), Aldrich Potgieter (Rocket Classic), William Mouw (ISCO Championship), Ryan Gerard (Barracuda Championship)
- Three PGA TOUR rookies have won this season: Karl Vilips (Puerto Rico Open), Aldrich Potgieter (Rocket Classic), William Mouw (ISCO Championship)
