Joel Dahmen (1st/-9)

- In his 232nd start on TOUR, bidding for his second career PGA TOUR title (2021 Corales Puntacana Championship)
- Totaled 10 birdies, including three consecutive on Nos. 7-9 to finish his round, against one bogey (par-4 14th)
- 61 ties his career low round on TOUR (R2/2020 RSM Classic/finished T50)
- Best finish in six prior starts at the Wyndham Championship is T42 (2017)
- Marks his sixth career 18-hole lead/co-lead in individual stroke play (0-for-5 to date) and his second outright 18-hole lead this season (Corales Puntacana Championship/finished T2)
- Three first-round leaders/co-leaders have won the Wyndham Championship since it moved to Sedgefield Country Club in 2008 (Brandt Snedeker/2018, Camilo Villegas/2014, Arjun Atwal/2010)
- Entered the week No. 101 in the FedExCup standings, needing a three-way T2 or better for a chance to qualify for the FedExCup Playoffs
- With a win, projected to climb to No. 48 in the FedExCup standings; would mark his sixth time advancing to the FedExCup Playoffs and his first since the 2021-22 season
- Owns three top-10 finishes in 21 starts this season (T9/Farmers Insurance Open, T6/Mexico Open at VidantaWorld, T2/Corales Puntacana Championship)

FedExCup Playoffs:

- Following the Wyndham Championship, the top 70 players in the FedExCup standings will qualify for next week's FedEx St. Jude Championship (the first of three events in the FedExCup Playoffs):
 - o FedEx St. Jude Championship (top 70 players following Wyndham Championship)
 - o BMW Championship (top 50 players following FedEx St. Jude Championship)
 - TOUR Championship (top 30 players following BMW Championship)
- Over the last two seasons, Lucas Glover is the only player who played his way into the playoffs through the Wyndham Championship (2023/Won, moving from 112th to 49th)
- 91 players in the field have a chance to move inside the top 70 based on their finish this week
- Based on the first-round leaderboard, two players are projected to move inside the top 70:
 - o Joel Dahmen (1st), $101^{st} \rightarrow 48^{th}$
 - Christiaan Bezuidenhout (T8), $74^{th} \rightarrow 66^{th}$

Comcast Business TOUR TOP 10:

• The Wyndham Championship also serves as the final opportunity for players to secure their spot inside the Comcast Business TOUR TOP 10, which rewards season-long performance for the top 10 players in the FedExCup standings at the conclusion of the FedExCup Regular Season

- The Comcast Business TOUR TOP 10 will share a \$40 million bonus, with the No. 1-ranked played earning \$8 million
- Two players in the field, **Ben Griffin** (No. 7) and **Keegan Bradley** (No. 10), look to solidify their position in the top 10, while three players in the field can play their way into the Comcast Business TOUR TOP 10:
 - o No. 23 Hideki Matsuyama (T110/E) needs to win
 - o No. 15 Robert MacIntyre (T19/-4) needs to win or finish solo 2nd
 - o No. 12 Andrew Novak (T64/-2) needs to finish in a 5-way T3 or better

Additional notes:

- Alex Noren (2nd/-8) ties his lowest round of the season with a 62 (R2/3M Open/finished T7) and claims his best 18-hole position this year (previous best: T9/PGA Championship/finished T17); at No. 141 in the FedExCup standings, needs to win this week for a chance to qualify for the FedExCup Playoffs
- Cameron Young (T3/-7), No. 35 in the FedExCup standings, birdied his final five holes (Nos. 5-9), tying his longest birdie streak on TOUR (2021 Sanderson Farms Championship/R2/finished T2); sits inside the top 10 after 18 holes for the third time this season (T4/The Sentry/finished T8, 6th/Travelers Championship/finished T52)
- Defending champion Aaron Rai (T3/-7) opens with a 63 in his bid to become the first player to successfully defend at the Wyndham Championship since Sam Snead in 1956; in 19 starts this season, owns eight top-25 finishes, with a T4 at the Mexico Open at VidantaWorld being his lone top-10
- Two-time PGA TOUR winner **Nico Echavarria** (T3/-7) cards a bogey-free 63, tying his lowest round of the season (R2/Texas Children's Houston Open/finished T32); entered the week No. 65 in the FedExCup standings, seeking to qualify for the FedExCup Playoffs for the first time in his third season on TOUR
- Mark Hubbard (T3/-7) records his lowest score in 25 career rounds played at Sedgefield Country Club with a bogey-free 63 (previous best: 64/R3/2020); at No. 98 in the FedExCup standings, needs a three-way T2 or better for a chance to qualify for the playoffs
- Kaito Onishi (neck) and Nate Lashley (foot) WD after the first round of the Wyndham Championship
