Weather: Friday: Mostly cloudy and humid with afternoon thunderstorms. High of 83. Wind NE 6-12 mph. The second round was suspended due to a dangerous weather situation at 4:32 p.m., with the entire afternoon wave yet to complete their round. **Saturday**: Mostly cloudy with morning rain showers. High of 68. Wind NE 10-15 mph. The second round resumed at 7:30 a.m. and was completed at 10:22 a.m. The third round will feature threesomes off split tees from 10:35 a.m. – 12:47 p.m.

Cut: 74 professionals and one amateur at 3-under 137 from a field of 155 professionals and one amateur

Cameron Young (1st/-15)

- With a personal-best opening 36-hole score of 125 (previous: 128/2022 Genesis Invitational/T2), equals the Wyndham Championship opening 36-hole scoring record (Carl Pettersson/2008/won)
- Marks second-lowest opening 36-hole score of the season (124: Scottie Scheffler/2025 CJ CUP Byron Nelson/won)
- Second-round 62 equals his lowest round on TOUR since the 2024 Wyndham Championship (also a second-round
 62)
- Holds the 36-hole lead/co-lead for the second time (2023 John Deere Classic/T6)
- Seeks his first PGA TOUR victory in his 94th start; five of his seven runner-up finishes came during the 2021-22 season, with two since (2023 WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play/2nd, 2024 Valspar Championship/2nd)
- Making his second start at the Wyndham Championship (T22/2024)
- Entered the week No. 40 in the FedExCup standings and is currently projected No. 16 with a win
- Has advanced to the TOUR Championship once in his first three seasons on TOUR, finishing 19th in 2022
- Has four top-10 finishes in 20 starts this season, led by back-to back T4s at the RBC Canadian Open and U.S. Open

Additional notes:

- Mac Meissner (T2/-12) posts a 7-under 63, his career-low round on TOUR; is now 23-under in six rounds at Sedgefield Country Club (2024 65-70-67; 2025 65-63)
- 2022 Wyndham Championship runner-up **Sungjae Im** (T2/-12) opens with matching 6-under 64s; has 24 rounds in the 60s in 26 rounds at Sedgefield Country Club
- **Joel Dahmen** (T2/-12) entered the week No. 101 in the FedExCup standings, needing a three-way T2 or better for a chance to qualify for the FedExCup Playoffs; owns three top-10 finishes in 21 starts this season (T9/Farmers Insurance Open, T6/Mexico Open at VidantaWorld, T2/Corales Puntacana Championship)
- Aaron Rai (T5/-11) trails by four in bid to become the first player to successfully defend at the Wyndham
 Championship since Sam Snead in 1956; Scottie Scheffler is the only player this season to successfully defend a title
 from last season (the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday)
- Mark Hubbard (T5/-11), at No. 98 in the FedExCup standings, needs a three-way T2 or better for a chance to qualify for the playoffs

- Gary Woodland (T7/-9) holes a 7-iron from 190 yards on the par-5 fifth hole for the third albatross on TOUR this season and the 144th overall since 1983; is the second double eagle at No. 5 on record (Johnson Wagner/R2/2017); 64 marks his best round since closing with a 62 for a season-best T2 at the Texas Children's Houston Open
- Erik van Rooyen, Akshay Bhatia, Isaiah Salinda, Aaron Wise and Tom Kim withdrew during the second round

FedExCup Playoffs:

- Following the Wyndham Championship, the top 70 players in the FedExCup standings will qualify for next week's FedEx St. Jude Championship (the first of three events in the FedExCup Playoffs)
- Players currently moving into the top 70:
 - O Chris Kirk (T7), from No. 73 to No. 63
 - o Gary Woodland (T7), from No. 75 to No. 67
 - O Davis Thompson (T7), from No. 78 to No. 70
- Players currently falling out of the top 70:
 - o Matti Schmid (T22), from No. 70 to No. 71
 - o **Cam Davis** (T40), from No. 67 to No. 72
 - O Byeong Hun An (MC), from No. 69 to No. 74

Comcast Business TOUR TOP 10:

- The Wyndham Championship also serves as the final opportunity for players to secure their spot inside the Comcast Business TOUR TOP 10, which rewards season-long performance for the top 10 players in the FedExCup standings at the conclusion of the FedExCup Regular Season
- The Comcast Business TOUR TOP 10 will share a \$40 million bonus, with the No. 1-ranked played earning \$8 million
- Two players in the field, **Ben Griffin** (T22/currently projected No. 6) and **Keegan Bradley** (MC/currently projected No. 10), entered the week inside the top 10, while two players remaining in the field can still play their way into the Comcast Business TOUR TOP 10:
 - O No. 23 Hideki Matsuyama (T41/-4) needs to win
 - o No. 15 **Robert MacIntyre** (T41/-4) needs to win or finish solo 2nd
 - o No. 12 **Andrew Novak** (MC) needed to finish in a 5-way T3 or better
