Cameron Young (1st/-20)

- Seeks first PGA TOUR title in his 94th start; age on Sunday: 28 years, 2 months, 27 days
- Holds seven runner-up finishes, the most on TOUR without a win since 1983 (most recent: 2024 Valspar Championship)
- With a win, would become the 1,000th unique winner on TOUR and the 12th first-time winner on TOUR this season
- With a win, would become the 23rd player to make the Wyndham Championship his first PGA TOUR victory
- With a win, would become fourth Wake Forest University alumnus to win the Wyndham Championship (Lanny Wadkins/1983, Scott Hoch/2001, Webb Simpson/2011)
- Holds 54-hole lead/co-lead for the first time on TOUR (previous best 54-hole position: 2nd, two times: 2023 Open Championship/T8, 2022 Genesis Invitational/T2)
- 54-hole score of 190 marks career best (previous: 197/2024 Travelers Championship/T9, 197/2022 The Genesis Invitational/T2); marks best 54-hole scoring record at the Wyndham Championship (previous: 191/Carl Pettersson/2008/won)
- Equals lowest 54-hole score of the season (190: Scottie Scheffler/CJ CUP Byron Nelson/won)
- Five strokes equals second-largest 54-hole lead on TOUR this season (5/Thomas Detry/WM Phoenix Open/won); (best: Scottie Scheffler/8/CJ CUP Byron Nelson/won)
- Five strokes equals the largest 54-hole lead in Wyndham Championship history (72-hole events only) (Doug Sanders/1963/won)
- Making his second start at the Wyndham Championship (T22/2024)
- Entered the week No. 40 in the FedExCup standings and is currently projected No. 16 with a win
- Has advanced to the TOUR Championship once in his first three seasons on TOUR, finishing 19th in 2022
- Has four top-10 finishes in 20 starts this season, led by back-to-back T4s at the RBC Canadian Open and U.S. Open

Additional notes:

- Colombia's **Nico Echavarria** (2nd/-15) seeks his third PGA TOUR title and first since the 2024 Baycurrent Classic
- Currently sitting at No. 73 in the FedExCup standings, **Chris Kirk** (T3/-12) needs a solo 43rd finish or better for a chance to qualify for the FedExCup Playoffs; seeks his seventh PGA TOUR title and first since 2024 The Sentry
- Defending champion **Aaron Rai** (T3/-12) looks to become the first player to successfully defend at the Wyndham Championship since Sam Snead in 1956; Scottie Scheffler is the only player this season to successfully defend a title from last season (the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday)
- **Mac Meissner** (T3/-12) seeks first TOUR victory in 51st start, needing a win for a chance to qualify for the FedExCup Playoffs; best career finish on TOUR: 4th/2024 Barracuda Championship
- No. 1-ranked player in the World Amateur Golf Ranking **Jackson Koivun** (6th/-11) looks to record his best finish on TOUR in his eighth start (best: T6/2025 ISCO Championship); with a win, would become the fourth amateur to win

since the start of the 1983 season (Nick Dunlap/2024 American Express, Phil Mickelson/1991 Northern Telecom Open, Scott Verplank/1985 BMW Championship)

FedExCup Playoffs:

- Following the Wyndham Championship, the top 70 players in the FedExCup standings will qualify for next week's FedEx St. Jude Championship (the first of three events in the FedExCup Playoffs)
- Players currently moving into the top 70:
 - **Chris Kirk** (T3), from No. 73 to No. 59
 - **Davis Thompson** (T7), from No. 78 to No. 68
 - **Gary Woodland** (T9), from No. 75 to No. 70
- Players currently falling out of the top 70:
 - **Erik van Rooyen** (WD), from No. 64 to No. 71
 - **Cam Davis** (T36), from No. 67 to No. 72
 - **Byeong Hun An** (MC), from No. 69 to No. 74

Comcast Business TOUR TOP 10:

- The Wyndham Championship also serves as the final opportunity for players to secure their spot inside the Comcast Business TOUR TOP 10, which rewards season-long performance for the top 10 players in the FedExCup standings at the conclusion of the FedExCup Regular Season
- The Comcast Business TOUR TOP 10 will share a \$40 million bonus, with the No. 1-ranked player earning \$8 million
- Two players in the field, **Ben Griffin** (T21/currently projected No. 6) and **Keegan Bradley** (MC/currently projected No. 10), entered the week inside the top 10, while two players remaining in the field can still play their way into the Comcast Business TOUR TOP 10:
 - No. 15 **Robert MacIntyre** (T56/-3) needs to win or finish solo 2nd
 - No. 23 **Hideki Matsuyama** (T21/-7) needs to win
