### Cameron Young (Won/-22)

- Earns first PGA TOUR title in his 94<sup>th</sup> start at the age of 28 years, 2 months, 27 days
- Earns 500 FedExCup points and projected to move from No. 40 to No. 16 in the FedExCup standings
- With the win, becomes the...
  - 1,000<sup>th</sup> unique winner on TOUR
  - 12<sup>th</sup> first-time winner on TOUR this season
  - 23<sup>rd</sup> player to make the Wyndham Championship his first PGA TOUR victory
- Prior to his win, seven career runner-up finishes were the most by any player on TOUR without a win since 1983
- Entered the final round with a five-stroke lead, his first 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR; bogeyed the par-4 first hole before recording five consecutive birdies on Nos. 2-6; claimed an eight-stroke lead with nine holes remaining
- Led the field this week in Strokes Gained: Putting (10.335) and total birdies (27)
- 72-hole score of 258 marks his career best (previous: 263/2024 Travelers Championship/finished 2<sup>nd</sup>) and matches the tournament 72-hole scoring record (Henrik Stenson/2017, J.T. Poston/2019)
- Largest margin of victory on TOUR this season:
  - 8 – Scottie Scheffler (THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson)
  - 7 – Thomas Detry (WM Phoenix Open)
  - **6 – Cameron Young (Wyndham Championship)**
- Largest margin of victory in the Wyndham Championship (72-hole events at Sedgefield Country Club):
  - 10 – Sam Snead, 1950
  - 7 – Mike Souchak, 1961
  - 6 – Sam Snead, 1946
  - **6 – Cameron Young, 2025**
- Wins in his second start at the Wyndham Championship (2024/T22)
- Fifth top-10 finish in 21 starts this season; previous best: back-to-back T4s at RBC Canadian Open and U.S. Open

### Additional notes:

- **Mac Meissner** (2<sup>nd</sup>/-16) records his best career finish on TOUR in his 51<sup>st</sup> start (previous best: 4<sup>th</sup>/2024 Barracuda Championship); second-year member climbs from No. 152 to No. 86 in the FedExCup standings
- **Mark Hubbard** (T3/-15) cards his second bogey-free 63 of the week (R1) and notches his best finish in nine career starts at the Wyndham Championship (previous best: T15/2020)
- **Alex Noren** (T3/-15) earns his second top-10 of the season (T7/3M Open) and his best finish on TOUR since the 2024 CJ CUP Byron Nelson (3<sup>rd</sup>)
- **Chris Kirk** (T5/-14) was the only player to move inside the top 70 of the FedExCup standings, climbing from 73<sup>rd</sup> to 61<sup>st</sup> with his second top-five finish this season (PT2/Rocket Classic)

- **Jackson Koivun** (T5/-14), No. 1 ranked player in the World Amateur Golf Ranking, records his second top-10 finish in his eighth start on TOUR (T6/2025 ISCO Championship); via his top-10 finish, earns a start in the next open event (Procore Championship)
  - **Koivun** becomes the fourth amateur to record a top-10 finish at the Wyndham Championship, joining Luke Clanton (5<sup>th</sup>/2024), Dick Chapman (T8/1947) and Frank Stranahan (2<sup>nd</sup>/1947, T3/1949, 8<sup>th</sup>/1953)
- In his bid to become the first player to successfully defend at the Wyndham Championship since Sam Snead in 1956, **Aaron Rai** (T5/-14) notches his second top-10 finish of the season (T4/Mexico Open at VidantaWorld)
- **Matti Schmid** (T31/-7) began the week ranked 70<sup>th</sup> in the FedExCup standings and remains in the same position following a final-round 71 that included three consecutive birdies on Nos. 16-18

#### FedExCup Playoffs:

- Following the Wyndham Championship, the top 70 players in the FedExCup standings have qualified for next week's FedEx St. Jude Championship (the first of three events in the FedExCup Playoffs)
- Players who moved into the top 70:
  - **Chris Kirk** (T5), from No. 73 to No. 61
- Players who fell out of the top 70:
  - **Byeong Hun An** (MC), from No. 69 to No. 74

#### Comcast Business TOUR TOP 10:

- The Wyndham Championship serves as the final opportunity for players to secure their spot inside the Comcast Business TOUR TOP 10, which rewards season-long performance for the top 10 players in the FedExCup standings at the conclusion of the FedExCup Regular Season
- The Comcast Business TOUR TOP 10 will share a \$40 million bonus, with the No. 1-ranked player earning \$8 million
- No players moved into the top 10 this week; Ben Griffin improved his standing from 7<sup>th</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup> via his T11 finish in the Wyndham Championship
- Comcast Business TOUR TOP 10 standings: No. 1 Scottie Scheffler, No. 2 Rory McIlroy, No. 3 Sepp Straka, No. 4 Russell Henley, No. 5 Justin Thomas, No. 6 **Ben Griffin** (T11), No. 7 Harris English, No. 8 J.J. Spaun, No. 9 Tommy Fleetwood, No. 10 **Keegan Bradley** (MC)
