Windsor, Ontario – Michael Brennan carded a 6-under 64 in the final round enroute to a five-stroke win at the BioSteel Championship to secure his first career victory as a professional, and moved into the No. 1 spot in the Fortinet Cup points list.

After starting the day with a four-stroke lead, Brennan saw his lead cut to one stroke when he made the turn. The second-year professional responded by making five birdies on the back-nine, resulting in a 5-under 30 to close the tournament.

Heading into hole No. 18 holding a four-stroke lead, Brennan converted on his birdie attempt to comfortably win by the largest margin in PGA TOUR Americas history and become the first wire-to-wire winner of the 2025 season.

“It was amazing. The wind was great off the right. I love when the wind is down off the right with my driver so I felt like I kind of just send it off the tee, hit a really nice tee ball,” Brennan said in his post-round interview. “I drove it really solid all week. I got a little distracted over the wedge shot, it was very poor, but I hadn’t made a long putt all week and Jeff and I kind of talked like, oh, we’re due, we’re due for the last couple days. It’s funny that seemingly when it didn’t really matter, that’s when it goes in. It was great to see it go in. It was cool to share that moment rather than tapping in or something.”

Since finishing as the No. 12 player in the PGA TOUR University Class of 2024, Brennan has finished in the top-10 16 times in 21 starts, and has made the cut in 12 consecutive events dating back to the 2024 Fortinet Cup Championship, the longest active streak on PGA TOUR Americas.

After four rounds, Brennan led the field in eagles made and made the second most birdies of the week. In addition to his scoring, Brennan only made two bogeys over four rounds, tied for the best mark amongst the field.

Brennan is expected to be in the field at the Manitoba Open, which will be contested at Breezy Bend Country Club from August 21-24.

About Michael Brennan (1st/-25)

- First career PGA TOUR-sanctioned win comes at the age of 23 years, 6 months, and 1 day.
- Won the BioSteel Championship by five-strokes, the largest margin on PGA TOUR Americas since 2024.
- With his win at the BioSteel Championship, Brennan is the first wire-to-wire winner on PGA TOUR Americas in 2025.
- Has made 12 consecutive cuts dating back to the 2024 Fortinet Cup Championship, the longest active streak amongst PGA TOUR Americas members.
- Has the most top-10 finishes of the 2025 season with eight. Brennan has finished in the top-10 13 times in 21 career starts on PGA TOUR Americas, 11 of which have come in his last 15 starts dating back to the 2024 season.
- Finished as the No. 12 player in the PGA TOUR University Class of 2024 to earn PGA TOUR Americas membership.
- Tied for third in Wake Forest program history with Curtis Strange with eight individual titles: Brennan only trails Bill Haas (10), and Gary Hallberg (9).
- Earned Co-Medalist honors at the 2024 ACC Championships and earned All-ACC honors four times during his time with the Demon Deacons.
- Won the Middle Atlantic Amateur Championship in 2017, 2018, and 2019.
- Won the 2019 Virginia State Amateur Championship.

Competition Notes

Course Setup: Par 70 / 7,033 yards; R4 average: 67.940

Weather: Sunny with a high of 32 (89). Wind from the south at 15-23 km/h with gusts up to 27 km/h.

- Fortinet Ambassador Michael Brennan secures his first career title with a five-stroke victory at the BioSteel Championship
- Shubham Jaglan became the first player from India to finish in the top-5 of a PGA TOUR Americas event with a T3 finish.
- Three countries are represented in the top five and ties: United States (3), India (1), and Colombia (1).
- Joey Savoie finished as the Low-Canadian heading at 15-under, good for a T9 finish.
- Ricardo Celia (Colombia) finished as the low-Latin after a final-round 6-under 64 propelled him to a T3 finish.
- Hole No. 3, the 507-yard par-5, played as the easiest hole in the final round (-0.606 strokes under par). The field made 40 birdies and four eagles on hole No. 3 on Sunday.

- Hole No. 14, the 237-yard par-3, played as the toughest hole at Ambassador Golf Club in the final round (+0.530 strokes over par).
