Bromont, Québec – Ollie Osborne and Dillon Stewart share the 36-hole lead at the Bromont Open presented by Desjardins at 14-under, after carding rounds of 61 and 63.

After a 5-under 65 in the first round, Osborne responded with the low-round of the day, a 9-under 61 to grab a share of the lead. Osborne's round was highlighted by an eagle on No. 9, his final hole of the day. After struggling in 2024, Osborne has sparked a resurgence this season and has finished in the top-25 in four of his last five starts, including a season-best T6 finish last week at the Explore NB Open.

In his second start as a professional, Stewart holds a share of the 36-hole lead in a PGA TOUR-sanctioned event for the first time in his professional career. Stewart, an Oklahoma State alum, made his PGA TOUR Americas debut last week in New Brunswick, where he finished T9 in his first PGA TOUR-sanctioned start.

Following his week in New Brunswick, Stewart has carded back-to-back round at 7-under 63, which included a 29 on his first nine holes on Friday. In six rounds on PGA TOUR Americas, Stewart has carded three 63's, and five sub-70 rounds.

Seventy-seven players made the cut at 5-under. Third round tee times are expected to run from 7:00 a.m. to 1:30 p.m local time on Saturday off the No. 1 tee.

About Ollie Osborne (T1/-14)

- Holds a share of the 36-hole lead for the first time in his 40th career PGA TOUR-sanctioned start
- Has finished in the top-25 in four of his last five starts, including a T6 finish at the Explore NB Open
- Attended Southern Methodist University, where he earned medalist honors twice in his four years with the Mustangs
- Finished as the runner-up at the 2020 U.S. Amateur Championship; competed in the 2021 Masters Tournament and the 2021 U.S. Open
- Selected to the All-American Athletic Conference (AAC) team in 2021
- Earned Academic All-AAC honors four times from 2019-2022

About Dillon Stewart (T1/-14)

- Holds a share of the 36-hole lead for the first time at a PGA TOUR-sanctioned event for the first time in his career
- Finished T8 at PGA TOUR Americas Q-School at Soboba Springs Golf Club in San Jacinto, California, to secure exempt membership for the 2025 North America Swing
- In his final two years at Oklahoma State in from 2021-23, Stewart was named to the Big-12 All-Academic team twice
- Won the Colorado Amateur Championship in 2023, and the Colorado Junior Amateur Championship in 2019
- Won the Colorado Junior PGA Championship in 2019

Competition Notes

Course Setup: Par 70 / 7,000 yards; R2 average: 68.013

Weather: Sunny with a high of 29 (85). Wind from the NW at 5-10 km/h with gusts up to 16 km/h.

- Ollie Osborne and Dillon Stewart share the 36-hole lead, after the playing the first two rounds at 14-under 126
- Three countries are represented in the top five and ties: United States (5), Chinese Taipei (1) and Ireland (1)
- Seventy-seven players made the cut at 5-under, including Shubham Jaglan, the first player representing India to hold PGA TOUR Americas membership, as well as Québec native Joey Savoie
- Hole No. 9, the 531-yard par-5, played as the easiest hole in the second round (-0.773 strokes under par): Players carded 24 eagles on No. 9 on Friday
- Hole No. 6, the 500-yard par-4, has played as the toughest hole at Golf Château-Bromont in the second round (+0.240 strokes over par)
