LIMA, Peru – Hunter Wolcott, David Lamb and David Perkins share the 36-hole lead at 10-under after the second round of the Diners Club Peru Open. Perkins carded a bogey-free 66 Friday at Los Inkas Golf Club to join Lamb and first-round leader Wolcott atop the leaderboard.

Wolcott's second-round 70 included a double bogey on No. 7, his 16th hole, where he was assessed a [one-stroke penalty](#) for exceeding the allotted time to play a shot, according to the PGA TOUR Americas revised pace of play policy. Wolcott finished the round par-birdie to earn a spot in Saturday's final group with Lamb and Perkins.

"It's pretty unfortunate. I do think the rule is good to hurry up slow players," [Wolcott said](#). "Nothing I can do about it now, still in a good spot. Happy about my game. Adds more fuel to the fire for the weekend."

Peru's Julian Perico is four strokes off the lead and T14, while American Conner Godsey improved 90 spots on the leaderboard and is T7 after a second-round 63. Third-round tee times will run from 8 a.m. – 12 p.m. CDT off the No. 1 tee at Los Inkas Golf Club.

About Hunter Wolcott (T1/-10)

- Made 10 starts on PGA TOUR Americas in 2024 after earning conditional status via mid-season Q-School (Finishers 10-25 from Q-School)
- Made eight cuts with three top-10s in 2024, highlighted by a solo-fourth finish at the Manitoba Open, and finished No. 34 in the Fortinet Cup to earn exempt membership for the Latin America Swing of the 2025 season (top 80 from Fortinet Cup)
- Father, Bob, played on the PGA TOUR from 1989-1992 and again in 1997; made 168 career starts, with two third-place finishes; recently inducted into the Tennessee Golf Hall of Fame
- Older brother, Ben, played golf at Ole Miss, and Hunter's twin brother, Collier, played football at the University of Tennessee-Martin
- Fiancé, Saydie, played college soccer at the University of Mississippi and Liberty University
- Plays chess in his head while on the golf course

About Davis Lamb (T1/-10)

- Won twice on PGA TOUR Canada in back-to-back weeks at the 2023 ATB Classic and Bromont Open; went on to finish No. 3 in the Fortinet Cup and earn Korn Ferry Tour membership for 2024
- Making his third career start on PGA TOUR Americas at the Diners Club Peru Open; best finish this season came at the 93 Abierto Telecom del Centro presentado por Zurich (T25)
- Made 25 starts on the Korn Ferry Tour in 2024, with his best finish coming at the 2024 Astara Chile Classic presented by Scotiabank (T11)

About David Perkins (T1/-10)

- Made 10 starts on PGA TOUR Americas in 2024 after earning status via mid-season Q-School
- Has made 10 cuts with five top-10s in 14 starts on PGA TOUR Americas
- Finished No. 28 in the 2024 Fortinet Cup standings to earn exempt membership for the Latin America Swing of the 2025 season (top 80 from Fortinet Cup)
- Has not finished outside of the top-20 in first three starts of the PGA TOUR Americas season

Competition Notes

Course Setup: Par 72 / 6,882 yards; R2 average: 71.586

Weather: Cloudy with a high of 77. Wind from the south at 1-7 mph with gusts up to 14 mph.

Cut: 2-under/72 players

- In his season debut, Yuxin Lin is T4 at 9-under; Lin finished No. 10 in the PGA TOUR University Class of 2023 and was No. 82 in the 2024 Fortinet Cup to retain PGA TOUR Americas membership this season
- Fred Funk is making his 1,000th career start this week on PGA TOUR Champions, and his son Taylor Funk is T4 at 9-under in his 56th PGA TOUR-sanctioned start
- Three countries are represented in the top five: United States (4), Argentina (1) and China (1)
- Argentina's Andres Gallegos (T4) is the low-Latin through 36 holes after carding a 6-under 66 in the second round
- Lawren Rowe (T14) is the low-Canadian after Friday's second round after a 5-under 67 on Friday
- Hole No. 3, the 509-yard par five, played as the easiest hole in the second round (-0.640)
- Hole No. 17, the 215-yard par 3, played as the toughest hole at Los Inkas Golf Club during the second round (+0.317)
