• Cameron Percy opened with 8-under 64 to tie the tournament 18-hole scoring record and leads after the first round of the Constellation FURYK & FRIENDS presented by Circle K.

### Cameron Percy, 32-32 - 64 (-8)

- Matched his low 18-hole score of the 2025 season (60th round)
  - o Previous instances: 2025 Stifel Charity Classic (Final Round), 2025 Principal Charity Classic (1st Round)
  - o Low 18-hole score on PGA TOUR Champions: 63 (2024 Rogers Charity Classic, 2nd Round)
- The 51-year-old seeks his first win on PGA TOUR Champions (36th start)
  - o Best finish: P2 (two times; 2025 Principal Charity Classic, 2025 Stifel Charity Classic)
- Making his 20th start of the 2025 season, he has eight top-10 finishes
  - Entered the week No. 11 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings
- Seeks his first win on a PGA TOUR-sanctioned Tour since the 2014 Price Cutter Charity Championship presented by Hiland Dairy Foods (Korn Ferry Tour)
- This is his third time leading/co-leading after the first round on PGA TOUR Champions (0-for-3)
  - o Co-led at the 2025 Galleri Classic (finished 6th)
  - Led at the 2025 Senior PGA Championship (finished 7th)
  - o Co-led at the 2025 PURE Insurance Championship (finished T11)
- Looks to become the sixth first-time winner of the 2025 season, joining Richard Green (Rogers Charity Classic), Thomas Bjørn (American Family Insurance Championship – team event with partner Darren Clarke), Ángel Cabrera (James Hardie Pro Football Hall of Fame Invitational), Steve Allan (The Galleri Classic) and Justin Leonard (Chubb Classic)
- Matched the low 18-hole score in Constellation FURYK & FRIENDS history
  - Previous instances of 64: Steve Stricker (2022, 2nd Round), Scott Parel (2023, 1st Round), Shane Bertsch (2024, Final Round)
- Making his second appearance at the Constellation FURYK & FRIENDS, he finished T65 in 2024
- Matched the largest 18-hole lead of the 2025 season on PGA TOUR Champions (3)
  - o Previous instance: Jerry Kelly (Mitsubishi Electric Classic)
- Matched the largest 18-hole lead in Constellation FURYK & FRIENDS history (3)

#### **Other Notes**

- World Golf Hall of Fame member **Vijay Singh** (T2) birdied his last two holes to shoot 67. The 62-year-old seeks his sixth win on PGA TOUR Champions (174th start).
  - Last win: 2023 Ally Challenge
- Chad Campbell (T2) opened with bogey-free 67. The 51-year-old seeks his first win on PGA TOUR Champions (34th start).
  - Best finish: T8 (2024 Principal Charity Classic)
- Jacksonville native **David Duval**, whose father Bob served as the head professional at Timuquana Country Club, carded 4-under 68 and sits T4.
- Four other players sit T4 at 4-under: Søren Kjeldsen, Matt Gogel, Robert Karlsson and Gene Sauers.
- Defending champion **Rocco Mediate** (T35) made a hole-in-one on No. 17 with a 7-iron from 155 yards.
- Making his 2025 season debut, tournament host **Jim Furyk** (T52) posted 2-over 74.
- Charles Schwab Cup leader Miguel Angel Jiménez (T62) played his final five holes in 4-over to shoot 75. This is
  his high 18-hole score of the 2025 season (60th round).
  - Previous high: 74 (three times)
- Bob Estes withdrew before the start of the first round and was replaced by Scott Parel (T35).
- J.J. Henry (back) withdrew during the first round.
