• Starting on No. 10, Australian rookie **Brendan Jones** birdied five of his six holes en route to 7-under 64 and the first-round lead at the Hoag Classic.

Brendan Jones, 33-31 - 64 (-7)

- The 50-year-old seeks his first win on PGA TOUR Champions (second start)
 - Previous finish: T60 (2025 Cologuard Classic)
 - o Turned 50 on March 3, 2025
- This is his low 18-hole score on PGA TOUR Champions (fourth round)
 - o Previous low: 72 (2025 Cologuard Classic, 1st Round)
- This is his first time leading/co-leading after any round on PGA TOUR Champions
 - o Previous best position after any round: T51 (2025 Cologuard Classic, 1st Round)
- Earned 2025 PGA TOUR Champions status by finishing T3 at Q-School (Final Stage) in December 2024
- Made 54 starts on the PGA TOUR, including 28 during the 2005 season
 - Best finish on the PGA TOUR: T2 (2005 B.C. Open)
- Won one event on the Korn Ferry Tour in 15 starts (2004 LaSalle Bank Open)
- Won 15 times on the Japan Golf Tour (T17 on that Tour's all-time wins list)
 - Ranks 11th in career earnings on the Japan Golf Tour
 - Named Japan Golf Tour Rookie of the Year in 2002
- Most recent international win: 2023 New Zealand Open presented by Sky Sport (PGA TOUR of Australasia)

- Rookie Freddie Jacobson opened with bogey-free 6-under 65 and sits T2. The 50-year-old, who earned 2025
 PGA TOUR Champions status by finishing 2nd at Q-School (Final Stage) in December 2024, seeks his first win
 on the Champions Tour (fourth start).
 - Best finish: T10 (2024 Constellation FURYK & FRIENDS)
- 66-year-old **Michael Allen** bettered his age with bogey-free 6-under 65 and sits T2. He seeks his ninth win on PGA TOUR Champions (275th start).
 - Last win: 2016 Bass Pro Shops Legends of Golf at Big Cedar Lodge (with partner Woody Austin)

- Defending champion Padraig Harrington sits T24 after shooting 2-under 69.
- Two-time Hoag Classic champion (2007, 2016) **Jay Haas** (T36) carded 1-under 70. The 71-year-old shot his age or better for the 27th time on PGA TOUR Champions.
