## Things to Know

• Seeking his first win on PGA TOUR Champions, **Ángel Cabrera** made two eagles on Saturday on his way to the low round of the day (66) and enters the final round with a two-stroke lead over **Alex Cejka**.

## Ángel Cabrera, 68-66 – 134 (-10)

- The 55-year-old seeks his first win on PGA TOUR Champions (26th start)
  - Best finish: 4th (2024 SAS Championship)
- This is his first time leading/co-leading entering the final round on PGA TOUR Champions
  - Previous best 36-hole position: T5 (2025 Trophy Hassan II) finished T19
  - Was 5th entering the final round of the 2024 Senior Open Championship (72-hole event) finished T5
- Matched his low 18-hole score on PGA TOUR Champions (76th round)
  - 66 at the 2019 Ally Challenge (Final Round)
  - o 66 at the 2020 Sanford International (2nd Round)
  - o 66 at the 2024 Stifel Charity Classic (1st Round)
- This is his low 36-hole score on PGA TOUR Champions (134)
  - Previous low 36-hole score: 137 (three times; most recent: 2024 Stifel Charity Classic finished T15)
- Making his third start of the 2025 season on PGA TOUR Champions, he has finished T19 (Trophy Hassan II) and T51 (Chubb Classic)
- With a win on Sunday, he would snap a winless streak of 10 years, 9 months (or 3,927 days), dating back to the 2014 Greenbrier Classic (PGA TOUR)
- With a win on Sunday, he would become the third first-time winner of the 2025 season on PGA TOUR Champions
  Previous instances: Justin Leonard (Chubb Classic), Steve Allan (The Galleri Classic)
  - A win on Sunday would be the 13th victory by a player from Argentina on PGA TOUR Champions
    - Previous winners: Eduardo Romero (5), Vicente Fernandez (4), Robert De Vicenzo (2), Ricardo Gonzalez (1)
- Started the week as second alternate and got in when Mark Hensby withdrew
  - Would be the second consecutive week with an alternate winning the event on PGA TOUR Champions (Steve Allan was first alternate at last week's Galleri Classic)

#### Alex Cejka, 68-68 - 136 (-8)

- The 54-year-old seeks his fourth win on PGA TOUR Champions (98th start)
  - 2021 Regions Tradition
  - o 2021 Senior PGA Championship
  - o 2023 Senior Open Championship
- Making his sixth start of the 2025 season, he has three top-10 finishes and entered the week No. 8 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings
  - T2 (Mitsubishi Electric Championship at Hualalai)
  - T6 (Cologuard Classic)
  - T8 (Hoag Classic)
- Will play in the last group of the final round for the third time this season (0-for-2)
  - Finished T2 at the Mitsubishi Electric Championship at Hualalai
    - Finished T6 at the Cologuard Classic

#### **Other Notes**

- K.J. Choi (3rd) is 6-under after shooting 68. The 54-year-old seeks his third win on PGA TOUR Champions (95th start).
  - Last win: 2024 Senior Open Championship
- Charles Schwab Cup leader **Miguel Angel Jiménez**, who held a share of the 18-hole lead, and **Greg Chalmers** are T4 at 5-under.
- Darren Clarke, who won the 2020 TimberTech Championship played at The Old Course at Broken Sound, is T6 at 4-under along with Joe Durant, 18-hole co-leader David Bransdon and World Golf Hall of Fame members Retief Goosen and Colin Montgomerie.
- Making his 999th combined start (PGA TOUR and PGA TOUR Champions), **Fred Funk** withdrew during the second round. **Scott Dunlap** withdrew after the second round.

#### **Team Competition**

- In addition to the PGA TOUR Champions 54-hole stroke play event, there was a team competition which featured 26 football legends.
- Format: On Friday and Saturday, there were 26 two-person teams (one Champions Tour player and one football legend) playing a two-man Best Ball. The counted score for each hole was either the Champions Tour player's gross score or the football legend's net score.
- **Tim Brown** (Pro Football Hall of Fame Class of 2015), paired with **Tim O'Neal**, won the inaugural team competition at the James Hardie Pro Football Hall of Fame Invitational by four strokes.
