Notable

- The "Keebler Tree" at the right dogleg on No. 13 was lost. Club is waiting to see how the hole plays this year without it before deciding to plant another tree there.
- Area had one of the wettest Mays in recent years.
- Straight line 60-plus mph winds on May 16 resulted in the loss of 8 large trees and multiple branches on other trees.
- The golf courses were originally built for employees of the Firestone Rubber Company.
- Colonel John Morley, who founded the GCSAA in 1926, was based at the Youngstown (Ohio) Country Club).
