• Charles Schwab Cup leader **Miguel Angel Jiménez** and Charles Schwab No. 3 **Steven Alker** share the lead entering the final round of the Kaulig Companies Championship.

Miguel Angel Jiménez, 70-66-66 - 202 (-8)

- The 61-year-old seeks his 17th win on PGA TOUR Champions (197th start)
 - Would remain 18th on the Champions Tour all-time wins list
- Seeks his third major title on PGA TOUR Champions
 - o Previous senior major wins (2): 2018 Regions Tradition; 2018 ISPS HANDA Senior Open
- At 61 years, 5 months, 17 days, would be the 22nd-oldest winner in PGA TOUR Champions history
 - o Would be the 50th instance of a player in his 60s winning on PGA TOUR Champions
- Seeks his fourth win of the 2025 season (13th start)
 - o Previous wins in 2025 (3): Trophy Hassan II (Feb. 6-8); Hoag Classic (March 21-23); Principal Charity Classic (May 30-June 1)
 - o Entered the week atop the Charles Schwab Cup standings
 - Has nine top-10s in 12 starts this season
- Would be the first four-time winner of the 2025 season on PGA TOUR Champions
 - Currently tied with Ángel Cabrera (3) for the most wins by any player this season
- Would be his first four-win season on PGA TOUR Champions
 - Jiménez's multi-win seasons (5): 2 wins (2018); 2 wins (2019); 2 wins (2020-21); 3 wins (2022); 3 wins (2025)
- This is his 22nd time leading/co-leading entering the final round on PGA TOUR Champions
 - Is 10-for-21 converting those into victories (2-for-4 in senior majors)
 - Led at the 2016 ISPS HANDA Senior Open (finished T3)
 - Led at the 2016 U.S. Senior Open (finished T2)
 - Led at the 2018 Regions Tradition (Won)
 - Led at the 2018 ISPS HANDA Senior Open (Won)

- Making his 10th appearance at the Kaulig Companies Championship, he has four top-10 finishes
 - Top-10 finishes (4): T2 (2016 at Philadelphia Cricket Club); 4th (2017 at Caves Valley Golf Club); T10 (2018 at Exmoor Country Club); T3 (2020 at Firestone Country Club)
- Matched the low round of the day (66) with Michael Wright (T3), Steve Flesch (T9) and John Huston (T22)

Steven Alker, 68-67-67 - 202 (-8)

- The 53-year-old seeks his 10th win on PGA TOUR Champions (86th start)
 - Would move into T35 on the PGA TOUR Champions all-time wins list, becoming the 42nd player to win 10 or more tournaments
- Seeks his second major title on PGA TOUR Champions
 - Previous major win (1): 2022 Senior PGA Championship
- Seeks his second win of the 2025 season (11th start)
 - Previous win: Cologuard Classic (March 7-9)
 - o Has eight top-6 finishes in 10 starts this season
 - o Entered the week No. 3 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings
- Looks to become the third multiple winner of the 2025 season, joining Miguel Angel Jiménez (3) and Ángel Cabrera (3)
- Would be his third multi-win season on PGA TOUR Champions
 - Previous instances: 4 wins (2022); 2 wins (2023)
- This is his 10th time leading/co-leading entering the final round on PGA TOUR Champions
 - o Is 5-for-9 converting those into victories (1-for-1 in 72-hole events)
 - Led at the 2023 Charles Schwab Cup Championship (Won)
- Making his fourth appearance at the Kaulig Companies Championship, he has finished T3 (2022), T16 (2023) and T7 (2024)
- Will play in the last group of the final round for the third time this season (0-for-2)
 - Trophy Hassan II (finished 2nd)
 - The Galleri Classic (finished T3)

Other Notes

- **Michael Wright** (T3) matched the low round of the day (66) and enters the final round at 6-under. The 51-year-old seeks his first win on PGA TOUR Champions (31st start).
 - Best finish: T5 (2024 Sanford International)
- Rookie **Freddie Jacobson** (T3) carded 67 for the second consecutive day and sits at 6-under. The 50-year-old seeks his first win on PGA TOUR Champions (12th start).
 - o Best finish: T2 (2025 Hoag Classic)
- Richard Green shot bogey-free 67 and sits in 5th at 5-under. The 54-year-old seeks his first win on PGA TOUR Champions (67th start).
 - Best finish: 2nd/T2 (six times)
- 36-hole co-leader **Tim Petrovic** posted 71 and sits T6 at 4-under along with rookie **Søren Kjeldsen** and 2004 WGC-NEC Invitational champion (held at Firestone Country Club) **Stewart Cink**.
- 18- and 36-hole co-leader Ricardo Gonzalez carded 73 and sits T9 at 2-under.
- Tom Lehman withdrew before the start of the third round.
