Notable

- Last year the tournament returned to its traditional routing of Stables-Meadows rotation after the 2023 Pines-Meadows rotation due to the streak restoration on No. 4 on the Stable Course.
- A creek restoration took place on No. 4 on the Stables Course in 2023. This summer the creek in front of No. 5 green on the Stables Course will undergo a restoration.
- The entire stream along No. 4 fairway was reconstructed and restored with a flood plain created and native vegetation established along the banks.
- The property was a horse farm prior to becoming a golf course.
