### Things to Know

- First-round leader **Jerry Kelly** and World Golf Hall of Fame member **Ernie Els** share the lead entering the final round of the Mitsubishi Electric Classic presented by Vensure.
- Kelly and Els matched the low 36-hole score in Mitsubishi Electric Classic history (129), previously posted by Stephen Ames in 2023.

### Jerry Kelly, 62-67 – 129 (-15)

- The 58-year-old seeks his 13th win on PGA TOUR Champions (178th start)
  - Would move into T19 on the PGA TOUR Champions all-time wins list
  - Last win: 2024 SAS Championship
- Would be his seventh season with at least one win on PGA TOUR Champions
  - Note: this is his eighth season since joining the Champions Tour in 2017
  - Kelly's lone season without a win: 2023
- This is his second-lowest 36-hole score on PGA TOUR Champions (129)
  - Low 36-hole score: 128 (2019 U.S. Senior Open – finished T2)
- This is his 11th time leading/co-leading entering the final round on PGA TOUR Champions (5-for-10)
  - Led at the 2017 Boeing Classic (Won)
  - Co-led at the 2017 SAS Championship (finished 6th)
  - Co-led at the 2018 Mitsubishi Electric Classic (finished T8)
  - Led at the 2018 U.S. Senior Open (finished T2)
  - Led at the 2019 Ally Challenge (Won)
  - Led at the 2020 Kaulig Companies Championship (Won)
  - Co-led at the 2021 Mitsubishi Electric Championship at Hualalai (finished 3rd)
  - Co-led at the 2022 Principal Charity Classic (Won)
  - Co-led at the 2022 Kaulig Companies Championship (Won)
  - Led at the 2022 Dominion Energy Charity Classic (finished T3)
- Will play in the last group of the final round for the first time this season
- Making his fifth start of the 2025 season, he has two top-10 finishes
  - Best finish of 2025: T5 (Mitsubishi Electric Championship at Hualalai)
  - Entered the week No. 30 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings

- Making his sixth appearance at the Mitsubishi Electric Classic, he has three top-10 finishes
  - Best finish: T2 (2019)

#### **Ernie Els, 65-64 – 129 (-15)**

- The 55-year-old seeks his eighth win on PGA TOUR Champions (111th start)
  - Last win: 2025 Mitsubishi Electric Championship at Hualalai
- Seeks his second win of the 2025 season (seventh start)
  - Has four top-5 finishes, including a win at the Mitsubishi Electric Championship at Hualalai
  - Entered the week No. 3 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings
  - Would be his third multi-win season on PGA TOUR Champions (2 wins in 2020-21; 3 wins in 2024)
- With a win on Sunday, he would become the second multiple winner of the 2025 season on PGA TOUR Champions, joining Miguel Angel Jiménez (2)
- This is his low 18-hole score of the 2025 season (20th round)
  - Previous low: 65 (two times; last: Mitsubishi Electric Classic, 1st Round)
- This is his low 36-hole score on PGA TOUR Champions (129)
  - Previous low: 130 (two times)
    - 2020 Hoag Classic – Won
    - 2024 Principal Charity Classic – Won
- This is his 12th time leading/co-leading entering the final round on PGA TOUR Champions (4-for-11)
  - Led at the 2020 Hoag Classic (Won)
  - Led at the 2020 PURE Insurance Championship (finished 3rd)
  - Led at the 2021 DICK'S Open (finished 2nd)
  - Co-led at the 2022 Mitsubishi Electric Championship at Hualalai (finished T6)
  - Led at the 2022 Hoag Classic (finished 7th)
  - Co-led at the 2023 DICK'S Open (finished 3rd)
  - Co-led at the 2024 Regions Tradition (finished T3)
  - Co-led at the 2024 Senior PGA Championship (finished T6)
  - Co-led at the 2024 Principal Charity Classic (Won)
  - Co-led at the 2024 American Family Insurance Championship (Won)
  - Co-led at the 2025 Mitsubishi Electric Championship at Hualalai (Won)
- Will play in the last group of the final round for the third time season (1-for-2)
  - Mitsubishi Electric Championship at Hualalai (Won)
  - Chubb Classic (11th)
- Making his fourth appearance at the Mitsubishi Electric Classic, he has two top-10 finishes
  - Best finish: 5th (2022)
- Is the lone player in the field without a bogey (or worse) after 36 holes
  - Last player to play a 54-hole event without a bogey or worse on PGA TOUR Champions: Steve Stricker (2023 Principal Charity Classic – finished T2)
- Matched the low round of the day (64) with Ángel Cabrera (T3) and Ricardo Gonzalez (T12)

#### **Other Notes**

- Looking to win back-to-back tournaments, James Hardie Pro Football Hall of Fame Invitational champion **Ángel Cabrera** matched the low round of the day (64) and sits T3 at 11-under.
  - Last player to win back-to-back tournaments on PGA TOUR Champions: Ernie Els (2024 Principal Charity Classic; 2024 American Family Insurance Championship).
- World Golf Hall of Fame member **Vijay Singh** carded 67 and sits T3 at 11-under. The 62-year-old seeks his sixth win on PGA TOUR Champions (162nd start).
  - Last win: 2023 Ally Challenge
- Tournament host **Stewart Cink** is T8 at 7-under after carding 68.
- Charles Schwab Cup leader and 2014 champion **Miguel Angel Jiménez** (T12) is 6-under after shooting 70.
- **Cameron Percy** (T12) made a hole-in-one on No. 11 with a gap wedge from 137 yards. He also eagled Nos. 13 and 18, becoming the first player since Miguel Angel Jiménez (2023 American Family Insurance Championship, 2nd Round, Nos. 2, 11 and 16) to make three eagles in a round on PGA TOUR Champions.
- 71-year-old **Jay Haas** (71st) carded 70 to shoot his age or better for the 32nd time on PGA TOUR Champions.
