Notable

- Course restoration was completed in between the 2023 and 2024 events. The project tried to return the layout to its original design. Bunkers were rebuilt and increased from 69,000 sq. ft. to 170,000 sq. ft. Five greens were rebuilt using templates from other William Langford courses. All tee complexes were regressed or rebuilt. Waterway on No. 16 green and No. 18 tee complex was changed. Tees on No. 18 were moved to the west side of the pond to create a more dramatic finishing hole.
