Things to Know

- 18- and 36-hole leader **Miguel Angel Jiménez** edged **Cameron Percy** and rookie **Søren Kjeldsen**, the medalists from the last two Q-Schools, in a sudden-death playoff to win the Principal Charity Classic.
- This was the sixth playoff in Principal Charity Classic history (and first since 2022).
- This was the third playoff of the 2025 season on PGA TOUR Champions.

Miguel Angel Jiménez, 63-66-70 – 199 (-17)

- The 61-year-old earned his 16th win on PGA TOUR Champions (195 starts)
 - Remains 18th on the Champions Tour all-time wins list
- Earned his third win of the 2025 season (11 starts)
 - Previous wins in 2025: Trophy Hassan II (Feb. 6-8), Hoag Classic (March 21-23)
 - Remains atop the Charles Schwab Cup standings for the ninth week of the season (of 12 possible weeks)
 - Has nine top-10 finishes in 11 starts this season
- This is his second three-win season on PGA TOUR Champions, dating back to when he joined in 2014
 - Previous instance: 2022 (3 wins)
- Matches Charles Schwab No. 2 Ángel Cabrera (3 wins) for the most wins by any player this season on PGA TOUR Champions
- Becomes the 23rd oldest winner in PGA TOUR Champions history (61 years, 4 months, 27 days)
 - Is the 49th instance of a player winning in his 60s on PGA TOUR Champions
- Improves to 10-for-21 when leading/co-leading entering the final round on PGA TOUR Champions (3-for-3 in 2025)
 - Co-led at the 2025 Trophy Hassan II (Won)
 - Co-led at the 2025 Hoag Classic (Won)
 - Led at the 2025 Principal Charity Classic (Won)
- Improves to 3-for-3 when playing in the last group of the final round this season
 - 2025 Trophy Hassan II (Won)
 - 2025 Hoag Classic (Won)
 - 2025 Principal Charity Classic (Won)

- Earned his first win at the Principal Charity Classic (six appearances)
 - Previous best finish: T2 (2016)
- Improves to 5-3 in playoffs on PGA TOUR Champions
- Improves his PGA TOUR Champions winning percentage of 8.20%, seventh-best among players with 10 or more wins

Other Notes

- Making his second start on PGA TOUR Champions since turning 50 on May 17, **Søren Kjeldsen** matched the low round of the day with 9-under 63 to finish co-runner-up.
 - The reigning Q-School (Final Stage) medalist led the field in birdies (20).
 - This is his second top-10 finish after a T8 result in his Champions Tour debut at last week's Senior PGA Championship.
- 51-year-old **Cameron Percy** closed with 68 to finish co-runner-up. This is his best finish on PGA TOUR Champions (27 starts).
 - Previous best finish: 3rd (2024 American Family Insurance Championship)
- 2019 champion **Kevin Sutherland** finished 4th at 16-under after shooting 68 on Sunday.
 - This is his first top-10 finish of the 2025 season (seven starts).
- Defending champion **Ernie Els** finished T6 at 14-under and moves up to No. 4 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings.
- **Ricardo Gonzalez** (T8) played all 54 holes without a bogey (or worse), becoming the first player since Steve Stricker (2023 Principal Charity Classic) to finish a 54-hole PGA TOUR Champions event without a bogey.
- **Mark Hensby** (T8) matched the low round of the day with 9-under 63.
- 67-year-old World Golf Hall of Fame member **Bernhard Langer** (T11) bettered his age with 7-under 65. It was his 30th time shooting his age or better on PGA TOUR Champions.
- Three-time champion (2007, 2008, 2012) and 71-year-old **Jay Haas** (T51) bettered his age for the second consecutive day with 2-under 70. It was his 35th time shooting his age or better on PGA TOUR Champions.
- 2013 champion **Russ Cochran** (77th) made a hole-in-one on No. 14 with a 6-iron from 167 yards.
 - It was the 10th hole-in-one in Principal Charity Classic history.
 - It was the sixth hole-in-one of the 2025 season on PGA TOUR Champions.
