Notable

- Last December storms took out 30 trees including the featured Cypress in #16 fairway.
- #6 green complex was renovated in 2024 with the green expanded by 1,200 sq. ft. providing more pin locations in the front lobe and areas in the back left and back right of the green.
- Upgrade of irrigation system since last year.
- Added drainage in areas on holes 1, 7, 10, 11, 14 and 18.

- In 2025 the #15 green complex was rebuilt, and additional Cypress and Oak tree plantings were added on the course.
- #8 green complex was rebuilt prior to the 2024 tournament.
- The course is said to be located where Robert Louis Stevenson got his inspiration for the famous novel Treasure Island.
- Every hole on the course was named after a significant place or character in the novel Treasure Island.
- Maintenance staff average tenure is 14.5 years at course.
- Tournament volunteers mostly consist of former employees and future turf managers who are finishing up their educations.
