• Seeking his first win on PGA TOUR Champions, **Richard Green** matched the low 18-hole score at the Regions Tradition since the event moved to Greystone Golf & Country Club with an opening-round 63. He holds a two-stroke lead over a quartet of players which includes the winners of the last two events on PGA TOUR Champions.

- Matched his second-lowest 18-hole score on PGA TOUR Champions (195th round)
 - Lowest: 62 (2024 Rogers Charity Classic, 2nd Round)
 - Previous 63s by Green: 2023 Principal Charity Classic (R3), 2024 U.S. Senior Open (R1), 2024 Charles Schwab Cup Championship (R3)
- The 54-year-old seeks his first win on PGA TOUR Champions (63rd start)
 - Best finish 2nd/T2 (six times)
 - 2nd (2023 Dominion Energy Charity Classic) lost in a playoff
 - 2nd (2024 Senior PGA Championship) 72-hole event
 - 2nd (2024 Senior Open Championship) 72-hole event
 - 2nd (2024 Rogers Charity Classic)
 - 2nd (2024 Sanford International) lost in a playoff
 - T2 (2024 Charles Schwab Cup Championship) 72-hole event

Other Notes

- Charles Schwab No. 2 Steven Alker (T2), who finished runner-up at last year's Regions Tradition, opened with 7-under 65. The 53-year-old has finished in the top 5 in six of his seven starts in 2025, including a victory at the Cologuard Classic.
- Charles Schwab No. 7 **Jerry Kelly** (T2) shot 65 and seeks his second win in three starts after capturing the Mitsubishi Electric Classic last month.
- Charles Schwab No. 4 **Stewart Cink** (T2) carded 6-under 30 on the back nine after going out in 1-under 35. He looks to win back-to-back tournaments after capturing the Insperity Invitational earlier this month. Cink has finished in the top 8 in six of his seven starts in 2025.
- Seeking his first win on PGA TOUR Champions, **Charlie Wi** (T2) posted bogey-free 65. His best finish on PGA TOUR Champions is 2nd (2023 Invited Celebrity Classic) and T2 (2023 TimberTech Championship).
- 2021 champion Alex Cejka sits in 6th after opening with bogey-free 66.
- Seven players are T10 at 4-under, including World Golf Hall of Fame member and Charles Schwab No. 3 **Ernie Els**, Charles Schwab Cup leader and 2018 Regions Tradition champion **Miguel Angel Jiménez** and three-time Regions Tradition champion (2019, 2022, 2023) **Steve Stricker**.
