#### Things to Know

- **Jerry Kelly** carded the low round of the day with bogey-free 65 and takes a one-stroke lead over **Y.E. Yang** into the final round of the Regions Tradition presented by Coca-Cola.
- **Weather Delay:** The start of the third round was delayed by one hour due to rainfall and began at 10 a.m. CT.

#### Jerry Kelly, 65-71-65 – 201 (-15)

- The 58-year-old seeks his 14th win on PGA TOUR Champions (180th start)
  - Last win: 2025 Mitsubishi Electric Classic (April 25-27)
  - Would be the 23rd player in PGA TOUR Champions history to reach 14 wins and would move into T19 on the all-time wins list
- Seeks his second win of the 2025 season (seventh start)
  - Would be his second win in his last three starts (finished T22 in his last start at the Insperity Invitational)
  - Entered the week No. 7 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings
- With a win on Sunday, he would become the second multiple winner of the 2025 season on PGA TOUR Champions, joining Miguel Angel Jiménez (2 wins)
- Would be his fifth multi-win season on PGA TOUR Champions
  - Previous instances: 2017 (2 wins); 2019 (3 wins); 2020-21 (2 wins); 2022 (3 wins)
- Seeks his third major title on PGA TOUR Champions
  - Previous major wins: 2020 Kaulig Companies Championship; 2022 Kaulig Companies Championship
- This is his 12th time leading/co-leading entering the final round on PGA TOUR Champions (6-for-11)
  - Is 2-for-3 in 72-hole events
    - Led at the 2020 Kaulig Companies Championship (Won)
    - Led at the 2018 U.S. Senior Open (finished T2)
    - Co-led at the 2022 Kaulig Companies Championship (Won)
- Will play in the last group of the final round for the second time this season (1-for-1)
  - Previous instance: Mitsubishi Electric Classic (Won)
- Making his seventh appearance at the Regions Tradition, he has three top-10 finishes
  - Best finish at the Regions Tradition: 4th (2023); T4 (2021)

### Other Notes

- 2009 PGA Championship winner **Y.E. Yang** carded bogey-free 67 and sits in 2nd at 14-under. The 53-year-old seeks his second win on PGA TOUR Champions (89th start).
  - Last win: 2024 Stifel Charity Classic
- 2024 Regions Tradition runner-up **Steven Alker**, who entered the week No. 2 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings, sits T3 at 13-under after posting 71.
  - Alker, who won the Cologuard Classic earlier this year, looks to become the second multiple winner of the 2025 season, joining Miguel Angel Jiménez (2 wins).
  - The 53-year-old seeks his 10th win overall on PGA TOUR Champions (83rd start).
  - Alker seeks his second major victory on PGA TOUR Champions (previous major win: 2022 Senior PGA Championship).
- Seeking his first win on PGA TOUR Champions (56th start), **Charlie Wi** (T3) shot 67.
  - Best finish on PGA TOUR Champions: 2nd (2023 Invited Celebrity Classic) – lost in a playoff; T2 (2023 TimberTech Championship)
- **Ángel Cabrera**, **Boo Weekley** and **Chris DiMarco** are T5 at 12-under.
- 18- and 36-hole leader **Richard Green** (T10) went bogey-double bogey on Nos. 9 and 10 on his way to 3-over 75. He is 10-under entering the final round.
- On his first hole of the day, **John Huston** (T60) made a hole-in-one on No. 10 with an 8-iron from 157 yards.
  - Since 2002, this is the third time a player has made an ace on his opening hole of a round on PGA TOUR Champions (previous instances: Walter Hall, 2006 U.S. Senior Open, 2nd Round, Hole No. 10; Shaun Micheel, 2021 Sanford International, 2nd Round, Hole No. 10)
- **Brian Gay** (injury) withdrew before the start of his third round.
