Things to Know

- **Miguel Angel Jiménez** birdied the 18th hole to take a one-shot lead at 14-under into the final round of the Rogers Charity Classic, looking for his fifth win of the season on PGA TOUR Champions. **Tommy Gainey**, making his PGA TOUR Champions debut, posts a second straight 64 to sit two back heading into the final round.

Miguel Angel Jiménez, 63-63—126 (-14)

- Looks to become the first player with five or more victories in a season on PGA TOUR Champions since Steve Stricker in 2023 (6)
- Fifth victory would extend his record as oldest player in Champions Tour history with four or more wins in a single season, which he set earlier this year at the Kaulig Companies Championship
 - Previous most: 3 wins (Bernhard Langer in 2017)
 - Note: Langer won seven times in 2017 but three of them were after he turned 60 on August 27, 2017 (PURE Insurance Championship, Dominion Energy Charity Classic, PowerShares QQQ Championship)
- With a victory, would become just the second international champion in tournament history, joining Carlos Franco (2016)
- Owns two top-10 finishes in six career starts at the Rogers Charity Classic, including a career-best runner-up effort in 2017
- The 61-year-old seeks his 18th win on PGA TOUR Champions (202nd start)
 - Seeks his fifth win of the 2025 season (18th start)
 - Previous wins in 2025: Trophy Hassan II; Hoag Classic; Principal Charity Classic; Kaulig Companies Championship
 - Entered the week atop the Charles Schwab Cup standings
- This is his 22nd time leading/co-leading entering the final round on PGA TOUR Champions (10-for-21)
 - Is 4-for-4 when leading/co-leading entering the final round in 2025
 - Co-led at the 2025 Trophy Hassan II (Won)
 - Co-led at the 2025 Hoag Classic (Won)
 - Led at the 2025 Principal Charity Classic (Won)
 - Led at the 2025 Kaulig Companies Championship (Won)

Richard Green, 65-62—127 (-13)

- Seeks his first PGA TOUR Champions title in his 71st start
- Round of 62 is one shy of the tournament course record, held by four players
- Held the 36-hole lead at the 2024 Rogers Charity Classic before finishing solo-second
- Notched five runner-up finishes during the 2024 season, but just four top-10s this year, including a season-best T4 at the Chubb Classic

Tommy Gainey, 64-64—128 (-12)

- Open qualifier and former PGA TOUR winner posts a second consecutive 64 to reach 12-under for the week
- Making his PGA TOUR Champions debut after turning 50 on August 13, would become the youngest winner in Champions Tour history (50 years, 4 days) with a win
- Seeks to become the first player since Richard Bland (2024 Senior PGA Championship) to win in his Tour debut
- Would be the 15th open qualifier to win on Tour and first since Dicky Pride at the 2021 Mitsubishi Electric Classic
- With a win would become the 23rd player to win on the PGA TOUR, Korn Ferry Tour and Champions Tour, and first since Stewart Cink (2024)
- Lone TOUR win came at the 2012 RSM Classic, where he defeated David Toms by one stroke
- Owns three wins on the Korn Ferry Tour, with his last coming at the 2020 Bahamas Great Exuma Classic
- Posted a 6-under 65 to finish T2 in the open qualifier, earning one of three spots in the event

Additional Notes

- **Ricardo Gonzalez** (T3/-12), bogey-free through 36 holes, posts a second-round 65; seeks his second win in his 53rd career start after claiming his maiden Champions Tour title at the 2024 Trophy Hassan II; entered the week at No. 30 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings with eight top-25 finishes this year, including a season-best T7 at the Kaulig Companies Championship.
- Two-time Charles Schwab Cup Champion and first-round co-leader **Steven Alker** (T3/-12) posts 5-under 65 in the second round; making his third career start at the Rogers Charity Classic, where he owns one top-10 finish (6th/2024); 53-year-old seeks his 10th win on PGA TOUR Champions (90th career start); seeks his second win of the 2025 season (15th start/previous win: Cologuard Classic); would be his third multi-win season on PGA TOUR Champions (4/2022; 2/2023); looks to become the fifth multiple winner of the 2025 season, joining Miguel Angel Jiménez (4 wins), Ángel Cabrera (3 wins), Steve Allan (3 wins) and Padraig Harrington (2 wins)
- Canadian players in the field: **Wes Martin** (T22/-5), **Mike Weir** (T50/-1), **Gordo Burns** (T54/E), **Stephen Ames** (T68/+2)
 - Ames holds the best career finish by a Canadian at the Rogers Charity Classic, T5/2015
 - Martin, a Calgary resident, open qualified after taking time away from his job as a full-time pipe fitter at nearby Furlong Steel
