Ernie, a bogey-free 63 on moving day to get to 11 under. Tell us about your round.

Thank you, it was an important round. You know, I kind of didn't quite finish it off yesterday. You know, I had it really going yesterday, but today I was really committed to get the round finished. So yeah, I had a good start, good front nine, and I felt good on the ball and on my iron shots. Listen, we've got a round to go and a lot of golf to play, but I'm in a good position.

Tell us about the bunker shot on 12.

Yeah, that was probably the shot of the day. I missed the fairway to the right on the par 5. I just wanted to get it over the hazard. I felt I couldn't get it over the bunker, which happened. I was in the bunker, but then I had about a good 30-yard bunker shot and hit it to where I tapped it in. So, that was the shot of my day.

Was there a certain element of your game you thought was working better today as opposed to yesterday.

It was very similar, you know, I kept it under control where I had chances. You know, I was squaring clubs closer to the flag, made some putts. I'd like to play the par 5s better. You know, I haven't played the par 5s all that well this week. But yeah, I'm just trying to keep it consistent.

What's the mentality being at the top of the leaderboard going into Sunday?

Well, it's [there for] anybody within four or five shots, you know, depending on weather. If the wind really blows, you know, anything can happen. Scoring conditions can be difficult, but I just got to go out there and try and make birdies, try and stay ahead. If I get behind, try and get ahead at the end of the day. So, you know, a lead really doesn't count at the moment.
