Things to Know

- **Ángel Cabrera** earned his second senior major title in less than a week at the 85th Senior PGA Championship at Congressional Country Club.
- PGA of America Golf Professional Bob Sowards (Kinsale Golf and Fitness Club in Dublin, Ohio) claimed the low pro honors out of eight Corebridge Financial Team Members playing the weekend.

Ángel Cabrera, 72-69-70-69 – 280 (-8)

- The 55-year-old earned his third win on PGA TOUR Champions (30 starts)
 - o 2025 James Hardie Pro Football Hall of Fame Invitational
 - o 2025 Regions Tradition
 - o 2025 Senior PGA Championship
- Earned his third win of the 2025 season (seven starts)
 - It is his third win in his last five starts
- Becomes the first player to earn his second senior major title on PGA TOUR Champions within six days
 - Won the Regions Tradition on Monday, May 19
- Becomes the 11th player to win consecutive senior major tournaments
 - o Last: Steve Stricker (2023 Regions Tradition, 2023 Senior PGA Championship)
- Becomes the 29th player to win the Senior PGA Championship in his debut appearance
 - Four of the last five have won in their debut (Previous: Richard Bland/2024, Steven Alker/2022, Alex Cejka/2021)
- Becomes the first player to win back-to-back tournaments on PGA TOUR Champions since Ernie Els won the 2024 Principal Charity Classic and 2024 American Family Insurance Championship
- Becomes the first three-time winner of the 2025 season on PGA TOUR Champions, passing Miguel Angel Jiménez (2 wins)
- Is now 2-for-3 when leading/co-leading entering the final round
 - James Hardie Pro Football Hall of Fame Invitational (Win); Mitsubishi Electric Classic (4th); Senior PGA Championship (Win)
- Won two majors on the PGA TOUR (2007 U.S. Open; 2009 Masters Tournament)

- World Golf Hall of Famer **Pádraig Harrington** held a two-shot lead after making seven birdies on his first 14 holes, but a double bogey on the 15th and a bogey on the 18th dropped him two strokes back, finishing T2 at 7-under in his fourth Senior PGA Championship appearance.
 - o Previous: T17/2024, P2/2023, T20/2022
- **Thomas Bjørn** eagled No. 16 to post 4-under on the day and claim T2 honors in his third appearance at the Senior PGA Championship.
 - o Previous: CUT/2024, T15/2023
- In his second appearance at the Senior PGA Championship one year after making his PGA TOUR Champions debut as a club pro from Mill River in Oyster Bay, NY, **Jason Caron** carded 1-under 71 for a T4 finish.
 - o In his first PGA TOUR Champions start, the former PGA TOUR player, followed a 4-under 67 in round three of the 84th Senior PGA Championship with a 5-under 66 to finish T4 at 12-under 272.
 - Earned status on PGA TOUR Champions for 2025 by virtue of top 36 finish in the 2024 Charles Schwab Cup standings (No. 36)
- Making his PGA TOUR Champions debut and first appearance at the Senior PGA Championship since turning 50 on May 17, Søren Kjeldsen finished 4-under T8.
- In his fifth Senior PGA Championship appearance, 2023 champion **Steve Stricker** finished 2-over T28.
- Defending champion Richard Bland finished T14 at 2-under.
