Things to Know

- First-, second-, and third-round co-leader **Pádraig Harrington** closed his final round with seven straight pars to top **Stewart Cink** by one shot and claim the 45th U.S. Senior Open Championship.
- 2022 champion earns his second U.S. Senior Open title in four years.

Pádraig Harrington, 67-67-68-67 – 269 (-11)

- 53-year-old World Golf Hall of Fame member earns his 10th win on PGA TOUR Champions (58th start) and second U.S. Senior Open Championship title in four years (2022)
- Becomes the eighth multi-time winner in tournament history, joining Miller Barber (1982, 1984, 1985), Gary Player (1987, 1988), Jack Nicklaus (1991, 1993), Hale Irwin (1998, 2000), Allen Doyle (2005, 2006), Kenny Perry (2013, 2017) and Bernhard Langer (2010, 2023).
- International players have now won 12 of 15 events on PGA TOUR Champions during the 2025 season.
- Marks the 13th time an international player has won the U.S. Senior Open and the fourth consecutive year: Harrington/2022, Bernhard Langer/2023, Richard Bland/2024
- Joins Steven Alker as the only players on PGA TOUR Champions with wins each of the last four seasons.
- Marks the 20th win by a player from Ireland on PGA TOUR Champions: Harrington (10), Mark McNulty (8), Des Smyth (2)

Other Notes

- Second- and third-round co-leader Stewart Cink earns runner-up honors in his first U.S. Senior Open appearance; 52-year-old earns his 9th top 10 finish this season (12th start)
 - Best finish in 23 U.S. Open Championships: 3rd/2001
- Charles Schwab Cup leader Miguel Ángel Jiménez shoots the low round of the tournament with a 6-under 64;
 61-year-old earns his 11th top 10 of the season (14th start) with third-place finish
 - Remains atop the Charles Schwab Cup standings for the 12th week (of 14 possible weeks) this season
 - o 2025 wins: Trophy Hassan II, Hoag Classic, Principal Charity Classic, Kaulig Companies Championship
- Thomas Bjørn cards 5-under in his second U.S. Senior Open appearance for a T4 finish; previous: T38/2024; 54-year-old earns his fifth top-10 finish this season (13th start); moves to No.7 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings

- Best finish: Won/American Family Insurance Championship (with partner Darren Clarke)
- First-, second-, and third-round co-leader **Mark Hensby** shoots 3-over on his 54th birthday for a T4 finish; moves to No. 20 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings
- **Steve Flesch** (6th) earns his best finish in his eighth appearance at the U.S. Senior Open; previous best: T13/2021 & 2022; moves to No. 11 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings
- Charles Schwab No. 3 Steven Alker (7th) finishes at even-par in his fourth U.S. Senior Open; best finish: T6/2023
- **Paul Stankowski** (T8) earns his second-consecutive top-10 finish in his third U.S. Senior Open (T8/2024); 55year-old entered the week at No. 49 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings, moves to No. 38
- Four players finish T9, including Jason Caron, Dicky Pride, Cameron Percy and Tim Petrovic, who made a hole-in-one on No. 8 from 178 yards with a pitching wedge.
- David Toms, who captured the U.S. Senior Open when it was last played at The Broadmoor in 2018, finished T45.
