## Things to Know

- First-and-second-round co-leaders **Pádraig Harrington** and **Mark Hensby** share the third-round lead with second-round co-leader **Stewart Cink** heading into the final round at the 45th U.S. Senior Open Championship.
- Harrington chipped in from 20 yards off the green on the 18th hole to tie Hensby and Cink at 8-under.
- Weather Delay: Play was suspended for 32 minutes due to lightning from 12:45 p.m. to 1:17 p.m. MDT.

## Pádraig Harrington, 67-67-68 - 202 (-8)

- The 2022 U.S. Senior Open champion looks to become the eighth multi-time winner in tournament history, joining Miller Barber (1982, 1984, 1985), Gary Player (1987, 1988), Jack Nicklaus (1991, 1993), Hale Irwin (1998, 2000), Allen Doyle (2005, 2006), Kenny Perry (2013, 2017) and Bernhard Langer (2010, 2023)
- Marks his fourth time leading/co-leading a Champions Tour event through 54 holes; converted two of those leads into wins at the 2022 U.S. Senior Open and Charles Schwab Cup Championship
- Will play in the final group for the first time this season
- Harrington never held a 54-hole lead at a major championship during his PGA TOUR career; entered the final rounds in T3, T2 and T4 for his wins at the 2007 Open Championship, 2008 Open Championship and 2008 PGA Championship, respectively
- The 53-year-old seeks his 10<sup>th</sup> win on PGA TOUR Champions (58<sup>th</sup> start) and second U.S. Senior Open Championship title
  - Last win: 2024 Simmons Bank Championship
- Making his ninth start of the 2025 season; has three top-10 finishes and entered the week No. 17 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings
- Making his fourth appearance at the U.S. Senior Open; has finished 1st (2022), T18 (2023) and T16 (2024)

## Stewart Cink, 68-66-68 - 202 (-8)

- Marks his first time leading/co-leading a Champions Tour event through 54 holes; previous best standing was solo-third at the 2023 Senior PGA Championship and Kaulig Companies Championship, where he finished third and T7, respectively
- Cink was 0-for-1 in converting 54-hole leads at major championships during his PGA TOUR career; held a share of the lead at the 2001 U.S. Open before closing in 73 to finish solo-third
- Will play in the final group for the second time this season

- Previous: Cologuard Classic/T8
- The 52-year-old seeks his third win on PGA TOUR Champions (27<sup>th</sup> start) and second this season
  Last win: 2025 Insperity Invitational
- Making his 12th start of the 2025 season, he has eight top-10 finishes and entered the week No. 4 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings
- Making his first appearance at the U.S. Senior Open; has competed in 23 U.S. Open Championships
  Best finish in U.S. Open: 3<sup>rd</sup>/2001

#### Mark Hensby, 67-67-68 – 202 (-8)

- On the eve of his 54<sup>th</sup> birthday, seeks to become the second Australian in history to win the U.S. Senior Open, and first since Graham Marsh in 1997
- Marks the first 54-hole lead/co-lead of his Champions Tour career
- Will play in the final group for the first time this season
- The 53-year-old seeks his second win on PGA TOUR Champions (68<sup>th</sup> start)
  Last win: 2023 Invited Celebrity Classic
- Making his 14th start of the 2025 season, he has one top-10 finish and entered the week No. 30 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings
- Making his fourth appearance at the U.S. Senior Open, he has finished 3rd (2022), T47 (2023) and T31 (2024)

#### Other Notes

- Charles Schwab No. 8 Thomas Bjørn shared the low round of the day at 4-under 66 in his second U.S. Senior Open appearance; previous: T38/2024; 54-year-old seeks his second win on PGA TOUR Champions (37<sup>th</sup> start), second win of the 2025 season (13<sup>th</sup> start) and first senior major title.
  - Previous win of 2025 season: American Family Insurance Championship (with partner Darren Clarke)
- Charles Schwab No. 3 Steven Alker (T6) shared the low round of the day to card 4-under 66 in his fourth U.S. Senior Open; previous best: T6/2023; 53-year-old seeks his 10th win on PGA TOUR Champions (87th start), second win of the 2025 season (12<sup>th</sup> start) and second senior major title.
  - Previous senior major win: 2022 Senior PGA Championship
  - Previous win of 2025 season: Cologuard Classic
- Charles Schwab No. 12 Steve Flesch sits 5<sup>th</sup> and seeks his best finish in his eighth appearance at the U.S. Senior Open; previous best: T13/2021 & 2022; 58-year-old seeks his fifth win on PGA TOUR Champions (184<sup>th</sup> start), first win of the 2025 season and first senior major title.
  - Last win: 2023 Stifel Charity Classic
- Charles Schwab Cup leader **Miguel Angel Jimenez** sits T6 after shooting 2-under 68; 61-year-old seeks his fifth win of the 2025 season on PGA TOUR Champions (14th start) and second-consecutive senior major.
  - Previous 2025 wins: Trophy Hassan II, Hoag Classic, Principal Charity Classic, Kaulig Companies Championship
- Paul Stankowski sits T6 and seeks his second-consecutive top 10 finish in his third U.S. Senior Open (T8/2024); 55-year-old seeks his first win on PGA TOUR Champions (91<sup>st</sup> start) and first senior major title; entered the week No. 49 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings
  - Previous best finish: T2/2022 PURE Insurance Championship
- David Toms, who captured the U.S. Senior Open when it was last played at The Broadmoor in 2018, sits T53.
