

TOURNAMENT HISTORY

- First played in 1905, the Visa Argentina Open presented by Macro -- which became a Korn Ferry Tour event in 2024 -- is the sixth-oldest national open still played today, only behind The Open Championship (1860), U.S. Open (1895), South African Open (1903), Australian Open (1904), and RBC Canadian Open (1904).
- Past champions of the event include Argentines Roberto De Vincenzo (nine times), Ángel Cabrera (2001, 2002, 2012), and Emiliano Grillo (2014), along with 17-time PGA TOUR winner Jim Furyk (1997), 16-time TOUR winner Mark O'Meara (1994), 13-time TOUR winner Mark Calcavecchia (1993, 1995), 13-time TOUR winner Craig Stadler (1992), and 16-time TOUR winner Tom Weiskopf (1979).

- Justin Suh broke the 72-hole tournament scoring record en route to winning the 118th Visa Argentina Open at the Jockey Club, which earned him an exemption for the 2025 Open Championship at Royal Portrush, where he missed the cut in his tournament debut.
- Suh previously earned his Korn Ferry Tour title at the 2022 Korn Ferry Tour Championship presented by Virginia's Richmond Region, which propelled him to 2022 Korn Ferry Tour Player of the Year honors and PGA TOUR membership.
- S.H. Kim was the only player who finished in the top 10 in 2025 who earned PGA TOUR membership at season's end.



As part of The Open Qualifying Series, the leading player not otherwise exempt who makes the cut qualifies for the 2026 Open Championship at Royal Birkdale. Prior to its inclusion in The Open Qualifying Series, the Visa Argentina Open awarded an exemption for The Open Championship to its winner through a partnership with The R&A (2016-2025).
