Taylor Dickson (T1/-15)

- Three-time Korn Ferry Tour winner cards a bogey-free 8-under 64 and holds the third 36-hole lead/co-lead of his Korn Ferry Tour career; 2-for-2 converting into victory (T1/2024 Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Kansas Wichita Open presented by Sydeo; T1/2026 Bahamas Great Golf Classic at Atlantis Paradise Island)
- Stands No. 13 on the 2026 Korn Ferry Tour Points List off the strength of his season-opening win at The Bahamas Great Golf Classic and two additional top-10s
- Class of 2024 Korn Ferry Tour graduate, collected two wins (Astara Chile Classic presented by Scotia Bank, Wichita Open) and three additional top-10 finishes en route to a No. 6 finish on the 2024 Korn Ferry Tour Points List to earn his first PGA TOUR card (top 30)
- Made 26 starts during the 2025 PGA TOUR season, highlighted by a T4 finish at the Zurich Classic of New Orleans with partner Trace Crowe; finished No. 174 in the FedExCup Fall
- Turned professional in 2015 after playing four seasons collegiately at Winthrop University (2011-15) where he won one individual title

Joseph Bramlett (T1/-15)

- Korn Ferry Tour winner birdies four of his final five holes (Nos. 5, 6, 7, 8) en route to 7-under 65 and his best 36-hole position on Tour (previous 36-hole high position: 2nd/three occurrences)
- No. 34 on the 2026 Korn Ferry Tour Points List off the strength of seven top-25 finishes, including three top-10s (best finish: T4/Tulum Championship at PGA Riviera Maya)
- Spent six consecutive seasons on the PGA TOUR from 2019-2025; relegated to the Korn Ferry Tour after a No. 164 finish in the 2025 FedExCup Fall

- Earned PGA TOUR membership for the first time since the 2011 season by finishing No. 22 in the 2019 Korn Ferry Tour Finals
- Finished No. 199 in the 2011 FedExCup standings as a rookie, earning TOUR membership with a No. 16 finish at 2010 PGA TOUR Q-School presented by Korn Ferry
- Turned professional in 2010 after four seasons at Stanford University (2006-10), helping the team win the 2007 NCAA Championship

Davis Shore (T1/-15)

- Cards a bogey-free 9-under 63 and holds the second 36-hole lead/co-lead of his career (T1/2026 Astara Chile Classic presented by Scotiabank/finished T18)
- Stands No. 15 on the 2026 Korn Ferry Tour Points List off the strength of four top-10 finishes with four additional top-25s, highlighted by a T2 at last week's Albertsons Boise Open presented by Chevron
- Holds full status for the 2026 Korn Ferry Tour season after a No. 39 finish on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List
- As a rookie, finished No. 73 on the 2024 Korn Ferry Tour Points List to secure full status for the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour season after beginning the 2024 season with conditional membership
- Earned conditional membership for the 2024 Korn Ferry Tour Season with a T81 finish at Final Stage of 2023 PGA TOUR Q-School presented by Korn Ferry
- Played four seasons at the University of Alabama (2017-21)

John Marshall Butler (T1/-15)

- Cards the low score of the second round with a bogey-free 10-under 62 and holds his best 36-hole position in what is his 22nd start (T2/2026 Pinnacle Bank Championship presented by Woodhouse/finished T28)
- Korn Ferry Tour rookie stands No. 60 on the 2026 Korn Ferry Tour Points List with three top-25 finishes (best finish: T3/2026 Visit Knoxville Open)
- Finished No. 7 on the 2025 PGA TOUR Americas Points List off the strength of his victory at the Mexico Championship presented by Scotia Wealth Management, earning Korn Ferry Tour membership for the 2026 season
- Finished No. 80 on the 2024 PGA TOUR Americas Points List in his rookie season after earning membership through PGA TOUR Americas Q-School
- Turned professional in 2024 after four seasons at Auburn University (2020-24); secured the winning point against Florida State's Luke Clanton to seal Auburn's 2023-24 National Championship

Chris Francoeur (T1/-15)

- Posts a 7-under 65 and holds the second 36-hole lead/co-lead of his Korn Ferry Tour career (1st/2026 Utah Championship presented by Zions Bank and Intermountain Health/finished T9)
- Stands No. 89 on the 2026 Korn Ferry Tour Points List with two top-25 finishes, highlighted by a T9 at the Utah Championship
- Recorded the 17th sub-60 round in Korn Ferry Tour history earlier this season at the Utah Championship, carding an 11-under 59 in the second round
- Played the previous two seasons on PGA TOUR Americas, finishing No. 13 on the 2025 PGA TOUR Americas Points List; he also played the 2023 season on PGA TOUR Canada
- Played four seasons at University of Rhode Island (2017-21) and one season at University of Louisville (2021-22), earning two individual victories in his time at Rhode Island

Rayhan Thomas (T1/-15)

- Posts a 7-under 65 and holds the first 36-hole lead/co-lead of his career in what is his 45th Korn Ferry Tour start
- Stands No. 68 on the 2026 Korn Ferry Tour Points List with three top-25 finishes, including a T3 at the BMW Charity Pro-Am presented by TD SYNEX
- As a rookie, finished No. 88 on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List, leaving him with conditional status (Nos. 76-100 from Korn Ferry Tour Points List) for the 2026 season

- Finished T42 at Final Stage of 2026 PGA TOUR Q-School presented by Korn Ferry to improve his status for the 2026 season (Next 40 finishers and ties)
- Advanced through First and Second Stage, and finished T42 at Final Stage of 2024 PGA TOUR Q-School to earn Korn Ferry Tour membership for the first time for the 2025 season
- Kerala, India native who played five seasons at Oklahoma State University (2019-24)

Andrew Kozan (T1/-15)

- First round leader follows up his opening 12-under 60 with a 3-under 69 in the second round
- First 36-hole lead/co-lead of his Korn Ferry Tour career in what is his 100th start (previous 36-hole high position: T3/2025 Visit Knoxville Open/finished T6)
- Finished No. 116 on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List, leaving him without status for the 2026 season
- Earned medalist honors at First Stage of 2025 PGA TOUR Q-School presented by Korn Ferry and advanced through Second Stage to Final Stage, where he finished T62, earning conditional status for the 2026 Korn Ferry Tour Season
- Marks his fifth consecutive season on the Korn Ferry Tour, with previous Korn Ferry Tour Points List finishes of No. 38 (2022), No. 94 (2023), No. 126 (2024)
- Played four seasons at the University of Auburn (2017-21), garnering All-Southeastern Conference Second Team and All-America Scholar laurels in 2019-20 and 2020-21

Additional Notes

- Seven-way share of the 36-hole lead matches the record for the most players tied for a 36-hole lead in a Korn Ferry Tour event (previously: 2021 Albertsons Boise Open presented by Chevron; 119th Visa Argentina Open presented by Macro)
- The 36-hole cut was made at 8-under 136, marking the second-lowest 36-hole cut relative to par in Korn Ferry Tour history (record: 9-under 133/2025 Veritex Bank Championship)
- **Jamie Wilson** (T32/-10), who was the last player in the field this week, is one of four players to make the cut after beginning the week outside the top 156 on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List
 - Jamie Wilson – No. 186 (projected No. 171)
 - **Kevin Tway** (T22/-11) – No. 158 (projected No. 146)
 - **Daniel Wetterich** (T62/-8) – No. 166 (projected No. 163)
 - **Dan McCarthy** (T62/-8) – No. 170 (projected No. 170)
