Yuta Sugiura (1st/-22)

- Cards a bogey-free 8-under 64 to claim the first 54-hole lead/co-lead of his Korn Ferry Tour career in his 19th start (previous 54-hole high position: T9/2026 Club Car Championship at The Landings Golf & Athletic Club/finished T22)
- Opened with an 18-hole career-low 10-under 62 in the first round on Thursday (previous 18-hole low: 65/three occurrences)
- At 22-under 194, establishes a new 54-hole career low score (previous: 199/2026 Visit Knoxville Open)
- First-year Korn Ferry Tour member is bidding for his first career victory (best finish: T15/119th Visa Argentina Open presented by Macro; Astara Chile Classic presented by Scotiabank)
- Bidding to become the third player from Japan to win on the Korn Ferry Tour, and the first since the 2024 season (Kaito Onishi/2024 UNC Health Championship)
- Advanced through First and Second Stage, and finished T29 at Final Stage of 2025 PGA TOUR Q-School presented by Korn Ferry to earn Korn Ferry Tour membership for the 2026 season
- Primarily competed on the Japan Golf Tour before the Korn Ferry Tour, where he collected three career victories over three seasons from 2023-25
- Captured his first Japan Golf Tour title as an amateur at the 2023 Dunlop Phoenix Tournament, turning professional immediately after his victory
- Plays from Aichi, Japan

Additional Notes

- 36-hole co-leader **John Marshall Butler** (2nd/-21), who remains bogey-free through 54 holes of play, establishes a new 54-hole high position (previous 54-hole high position: T4/2026 Pinnacle Bank Championship/finished T28)
- Korn Ferry Tour winner **Zack Fischer** (T3/-19), who ended a streak of six consecutive missed cuts this week, cards a bogey-free 8-under 64 and seeks his second victory of the 2026 season (previous: OccuNet Classic presented by Amarillo National Bank)
- **Petr Hruby** (T5/-18), who began the 2026 season with conditional Korn Ferry Tour membership, stands inside the top 10 through 54 holes for the first time in what is his 38th start on Tour (previous 54-hole high position: T13/2025 Bahamas Great Abaco Classic at The Abaco Club/finished T31)
- **Mahanth Chirravuri** (T5/-18), who finished No. 8 in the 2026 PGA TOUR University Ranking, matches his career-low round with an 8-under 64 and is positioned for his first top-10 finish in what is his 10th start (best finish: T19/2026 Pinnacle Bank Championship presented by Woodhouse)
- Upon conclusion of this week's AdventHealth Championship, the top 156 players on the Korn Ferry Tour Points List will qualify for the Simmons Bank Open for the Snedeker Foundation, the first of four season-ending Korn Ferry Tour Finals events
 - Four players who began the week outside the top 156 on the 2026 Korn Ferry Tour Points List made the cut and are bidding to move into the top 156 Sunday afternoon:
 - **Kevin Tway** (T29/-15) – No. 158 (projected No. 149)
 - **Daniel Wetterich** (T39/-15) – No. 166 (projected No. 159)
