Doc Redman (1st/-15)

- Makes eight birdies, including back-to-back birdies at the par-4 17th and par-5 18th to finish his round, en route to 6-under 65 and a two-stroke lead over Davis Shore at 15-under 198
- Holds his first 54-hole lead/co-lead in a Korn Ferry Tour event (previous career-high 54-hole position: 2nd/2024 Korn Ferry Tour Championship presented by Virginia’s Richmond Region/finished T2)
- Retained Korn Ferry Tour membership for the 2026 Korn Ferry Tour Season with a T34 finish at Final Stage of 2025 PGA TOUR Q-School presented by Korn Ferry
- One of four players to make the cut in all six events of the 2026 Korn Ferry Tour Season (Ian Holt, Jorge Fernández Valdés, and Caleb VanArragon)
- Third consecutive season with Korn Ferry Tour membership; his previous Korn Ferry Tour Points List finishes were No. 37 (2024) and No. 138 (2025); he took nearly three months off amid the 2025 season (March-May), saying he was “pretty unhappy traveling and playing golf, and a little lost in that sense.”
- Played four full seasons on the PGA TOUR (2020-23) after he earned Special Temporary Membership with a solo second (as an open qualifier) at the 2019 Rocket Classic; he followed the accomplishment with consecutive FedExCup Playoffs appearances in 2020 and 2021, though he was relegated to the Korn Ferry Tour after a No. 157 finish in the 2023 FedExCup Fall standings
- Played two seasons at Clemson University (2016-18), where he earned two individual victories, garnered a 2017 All-America Third Team selection, and broke the school record for career scoring average (70.70) previously established by two-time PGA TOUR winner D.J. Trahan (71.49 from 1999-2003)
- Won the 2017 U.S. Amateur, defeating Doug Ghim in a playoff in the championship match at The Riviera Country Club

Additional Notes

- **Davis Shore** (2nd/-13), who finished No. 50 on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List, establishes a new career-high 54-hole position (previous: T3/2024 Astara Chile Classic presented by Scotiabank/finished T11)
- **Michael Johnson** (T3/-12), who finished No. 48 on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List, matches the low round of the day (Maxwell Moldovan) with an 8-under 63; he stands T3 through 54 holes for the second time this season (The Bahamas Golf Classic at Atlantis Paradise Island/finished T16), and is one of four players with four top-25s this season (Mason Andersen, Jorge Fernández Valdés, Ian Holt)
- Rookie **Chad Sewell** (T3/-12), who earned Korn Ferry Tour membership with a T34 finish at Final Stage of 2025 PGA TOUR Q-School presented by Korn Ferry, stands in the top five through 54 holes for a second consecutive event (T5/119th Visa Argentina Open presented by Macro/finished T9)
- **Kyle Westmoreland** (T7/-10) and **John Pak** (T10/-9) are the only players who stand T10 or higher on the leaderboard with a Korn Ferry Tour victory
- Argentine amateur Segundo Oliva Pinto (T10/-9), who qualified for this week's event with a T7 finish at the 119th Visa Argentina Open presented by Macro last week, cards 5-under 66 and climbs 20 places on the leaderboard; his top-10 last week was the first by an amateur in a Korn Ferry Tour event since 2022 (Cole Anderson/T3/Live and Work in Maine Open)
- Four of this season's first five events were won by 54-hole leaders/co-leaders
