Tommy Morrison (1st/-21)

- Makes six consecutive birdies on the back nine (Nos. 12-17) to card 7-under 64, his 14th consecutive round in the 60s, and secure a one-stroke lead at 21-under 192
- Holds his first 54-hole lead/co-lead in what is his fourth career start on Tour (stood T2 through 54 holes each of the previous two events)
- Stands No. 29 on the 2026 Korn Ferry Tour Points List with three top-10s in as many starts – including a runner-up finish in the previous event, The Blue Championship – since earning Tour membership via PGA TOUR University performance benefits
- Finished No. 6 in the 2026 PGA TOUR University Ranking after three and a half seasons at University of Texas (2023-26), earning Korn Ferry Tour membership for the remainder of the 2026 season
- Bidding to become the fifth player to earn a Korn Ferry Tour win in the same season they earned membership via PGA TOUR University performance benefits
 - Pierceson Coody | No. 1 in 2022 PGA TOUR University Ranking, won 2022 Live and Work in Maine Open
 - Adrien Dumont de Chassart | No. 3 in 2023 PGA TOUR University Ranking, won 2023 BMW Charity Pro-Am presented by TD SYNEX
 - Ricky Castillo | No. 9 in 2023 PGA TOUR University Ranking, won 2023 Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Kansas Wichita Open
 - Karl Vilips | No. 10 in 2024 PGA TOUR University Ranking, won 2024 Utah Championship presented by Zions Bank and Intermountain Health
- Won the 2024 European Amateur Championship, becoming the first American to win the event
- Runner-up finisher at the 2022 North and South Amateur Championship, where he fell to Luke Clanton in the championship match contested on Pinehurst No. 2

Dylan Menante (2nd/-20)

- Following a lone birdie on the front nine (par-5 fifth), cards five birdies (Nos. 10, 13, 15, 17, 18) and one bogey (par-4 16th) for a 4-under 31 on the back nine and a round of 5-under 66
- Ties his career-high 54-hole position in a Korn Ferry Tour event (previous: 2nd/2025 Visit Knoxville Open/finished T3; T2/2026 Tulum Championship at PGA Riviera Maya/Won)
- Overcame a one-stroke 54-hole deficit en route to his first Korn Ferry Tour title at the 2026 Tulum Championship at PGA Riviera Maya, where he carded a 9-under 63 in the final round for a six-stroke victory
- Stands No. 14 on the 2026 Korn Ferry Tour Points List off the strength of his win at the Tulum Championship at PGA Riviera Maya
- Finished No. 53 on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List as a rookie; he finished T24 in his tournament debut at the Evans Scholars Invitational, marking one of seven top-25s in his 22 starts last season
- Earned PGA TOUR Americas membership for the 2024 season via PGA TOUR University performance benefits and finished No. 70 on the 2024 PGA TOUR Americas Points List
- Finished No. 15 in the 2024 PGA TOUR University Ranking after three seasons at Pepperdine University (2019-22) and two seasons at University of North Carolina (2022-24)
- Won back-to-back Northeast Amateur titles in 2021 and 2022

Additional Notes

- The last five Korn Ferry Tour events were won by 54-hole leaders/co-leaders, and the largest 54-hole deficit overcome by a winner this season is two strokes (Ian Holt/The Panama Championship; Doc Redman/Visit Knoxville Open)
- **Blades Brown** (T3/-16) opens with five consecutive birdies and closes with six consecutive birdies to card the low round of the week, a 10-under 61; he ties the Korn Ferry Tour record for consecutive birdies to finish a round, becoming the 13th player in history to accomplish the feat (most recent: Samuel Anderson/2025 LECOM Suncoast Classic/Round 2)
- **Ian Holt** (T9/-14) and **Doc Redman** (T9/-14) are bidding for the Three-Victory Promotion, which would grant them an automatic and immediate promotion to the PGA TOUR
