Extended forecast – Pleasant conditions continue through Saturday with temperatures gradually warming into the upper 70s to low 80s. Sunday looks to be the warmest and most humid day this week with high temperatures approaching 90F. The increased heat and humidity on Sunday brings along increased shower/t-storm chances. There is potential for weakening showers to move into the area from southern Wisconsin early Sunday morning, with additional thunderstorm development possible in the Chicagoland area during the late afternoon/early evening. Confidence on t-storm chances and timing remains relatively low with guidance providing multiple solutions including some that keep us mostly dry.
