**Drew Nesbitt (1st/-21)**

- First-round leader reclaims the 54-hole solo lead, following a 6-under 65 with seven birdies against one bogey in the third round
- At 21-under 192, establishes a new 54-hole career low score (previous 54-hole low: 204/2026 Visit Knoxville Open)
- Opened the tournament with an 11-under 60 with eight birdies and two eagles against one bogey, matching the 18-hole tournament scoring record at the Memorial Health Championship presented by LRS (fifth occurrence: Taylor Moore/2021/R3; Rob Oppenheim/2022/R3; Jackson Suber/2024/R2; Sandy Scott/2025/R4)
- Holds first 54-hole lead/co-lead of his career (previous 54-hole high position: T39/2026 LECOM Suncoast Classic/finished T38)
- Bidding for first career Korn Ferry Tour victory in what is his 13th start on Tour (best finish: T26/2026 Astara Chile Classic presented by Scotiabank)
- Owns four made cuts over 12 starts this season (best finish: T26/Astara Chile Classic presented by Scotiabank)
- First-year Korn Ferry Tour member earned membership for the 2026 season with a No. 8 finish on the 2025 PGA TOUR Americas Points List
- Finished No. 8 on the 2025 PGA TOUR Americas Points List off the strength of his victory at the Digital Commerce Group Open, as well as two additional top-10 finishes
- Logged 25 career starts on PGA TOUR Latinoamérica from 2018-22, highlighted by his first PGA TOUR-sanctioned victory at the 60th Mexico Open

- Carded the first and only 59 ever recorded in PGA TOUR Latinoamérica history during the second round of the 65th ECP Brazil Open
- Played one full season on PGA TOUR Canada in 2022, logging eight starts with one top-25 finish
- Turned professional in 2014 after graduating from Eastview Secondary School in Barrie, Ontario, forgoing collegiate golf
- Toronto, Canada native, who resides in Tampa, Florida

#### **Additional Notes**

- **Tommy Morrison** (T2/-20), who finished No. 6 in the 2026 PGA TOUR University Ranking, sets an 18-hole career low score with a bogey-free 10-under 61 (previous career low: 65/twice)
- **Frankie Harris** (T2/-20), who finished No. 9 in the PGA TOUR University Class of 2026, and Korn Ferry Tour winner **Zac Blair** (T6/-18) are the only players bogey-free through 54 holes
- Two-time PGA TOUR winner **Troy Merritt** (T2/-20) holds his best 54-hole position in a TOUR-sanctioned event since he held a share of the 54-hole lead at the 2021 Rocket Classic (finished T2)
- **Michael Johnson** (T2/-20), who stands No. 9 on the 2026 Korn Ferry Tour Points List, holds his best 54-hole position at the Memorial Health Championship in what is his eighth start (previous: T10/2024/finished T8)
- 36-hole leader **Will Cannon** (T6/-18), who's making his fifth start at the Memorial Health Championship, posts a 2-under 69, overcoming a triple bogey (seven) on the par-4 fourth; matches the best 54-hole position of his career (T6/2025 Pinnacle Bank Championship presented by Woodhouse/finished T8)
- Former University of Arizona Wildcat **Filip Jakubcik** (T9/-17), who finished No. 4 in the PGA TOUR University Class of 2026, records an ace with a 9-iron on the 154-yard par-3 second en route to 7-under 64
