

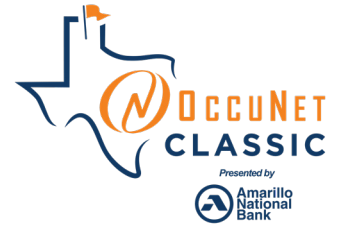


OccuNet Classic presented by Amarillo National Bank

PLAYERS TO WATCH



Cole Hammer, a Houston, Texas native, stands No. 26 on the 2026 Korn Ferry Tour Points List. Hammer, who played four seasons at the University of Texas (2018-22), has finished No. 65 (2024) and No. 71 (2025) the past two seasons on the Korn Ferry Tour Points List. The Texas native advanced through U.S. Open Final Qualifying in Gastonia, North Carolina to earn a start at next week's 126th U.S. Open at Shinnecock Hills Golf Club; it will be his fourth appearance at the U.S. Open.



Logan McAllister, who earned his first Korn Ferry Tour title at the 2025 Astara Chile Classic presented by Scotiabank, finished runner-up at last week's BMW Charity Pro-AM presented by TD SYNEX for his second consecutive top-five finish (T5/UNC Health Championship). McAllister, who stands No. 18 on the 2026 Points List, is an Oklahoma City native and played four seasons at the University of Oklahoma (2018-2022).



Four-time PGA TOUR winner **Ryan Palmer** will make his first Korn Ferry Tour start since the 2024 Memorial Health Championship presented by LRS (T34). Palmer, who was born in Amarillo, Texas, graduated from the Korn Ferry Tour at the conclusion of the 2003 season with a No. 6 finish on the final money list. Palmer has made 542 PGA TOUR starts since his rookie season in 2004; only Lucas Glover has logged more starts on TOUR during that period (571 starts).



Sandy Scott, who played collegiately at Texas Tech University (2016-21), stands No. 24 on the 2026 Korn Ferry Tour Points List. Scott has made the cut in 11 of 12 starts this season, logging six top-25s and a top-10. The Nair, Scotland native finished No. 55 on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List as a rookie, earning full status for the 2026 season.



Preston Summerhays, who stands No. 99 on the 2026 Korn Ferry Tour Points List, is coming off his best finish of the season at the BMW Charity Pro-Am (T7). Summerhays earned Korn Ferry Tour membership last season with a No. 7 finish in the PGA TOUR University Class of 2025 after four seasons at Arizona State University (2021-25).

TOURNAMENT NOTES

- The 2026 Korn Ferry Tour Season continues with the inaugural playing of the OccuNet Charity Classic presented by Amarillo National Bank, the 14th tournament of this season's 25-event schedule.
- Field includes 11 PGA TOUR winners with 23 total victories, led by **Ryan Palmer** with four wins.
- Field includes 55 Korn Ferry Tour winners with 79 career victories, led by four-time winner **Robby Shelton**.
- Eight players in the field stand in the top 200 of the Official World Golf Ranking: **Doc Redman** (No. 123), **Ian Holt** (No. 143), **Davis Lamb** (No. 157), **Jeremy Gandon** (No. 174), **Carson Young** (No. 179), **Ben Kohles** (No. 191), **Alistair Docherty** (No. 194), and **Jay Card III** (No. 197).
- Nine of the top-10 finishers in the PGA TOUR University Class of 2026 will make their debuts as Korn Ferry Tour members: No. 2 **Christiaan Maas** (Texas), No. 3 **Jase Summy** (Oklahoma), No. 4 **Filip Jakubcik** (Arizona), No. 5 **Luke Potter** (Texas), No. 6 **Tommy Morrison** (Texas), No. 7 **William Sides** (SMU), No. 8 **Mahanth Chirravuri** (Pepperdine), No. 9 **Frankie Harris** (South Carolina), and No. 10 **Wells Williams** (Vanderbilt). Chirravuri made his professional debut as a sponsor exemption at last week's BMW Charity Pro-Am presented by TD SYNEX.
- Four players in this week's field advanced through U.S. Open Final Qualifying and will compete at the 126th U.S. Open at Shinnecock Hills Golf Club in Southampton, New York next week: **Cole Hammer**, **Robbie Higgins**, **James Nicholas**, and **Jake Peacock**.

2026 KEY STORYLINES

- **Ian Holt** and **Doc Redman**, Nos. 1 and 2 on the 2026 Korn Ferry Tour Points List, respectively, are the only two multi-time winners this season. Should either win for a third time this season, they will earn an automatic promotion to the PGA TOUR via the Three-Victory Promotion. Matt McCarty (2024) was the last player to achieve the Three-Victory Promotion.
- The Route 66 Cup presented by Compliance Solutions kicks off this week at OccuNet Classic. The competition will span across four Korn Ferry Tour events, culminating at the Compliance Solutions Championship (Oct. 1 - 4), with players competing for a bonus prize pool of \$100,000. The winner of the Route 66 Cup will receive \$66,000, with additional payouts of \$22,500 for second place and \$11,500 for third place.
- Upon conclusion of the 25-event Korn Ferry Tour season, the top 20 players on the 2026 Korn Ferry Tour Points List will be awarded PGA TOUR cards (i.e. - membership) for the 2027 season. Additionally, the player who finishes No. 1 will earn exemptions for the 2027 PLAYERS Championship and 2027 U.S. Open.
- Following the Compliance Solutions Championship, the third of four season-ending Korn Ferry Tour Finals events, the top 60 players on the 2026 Korn Ferry Tour Points List will qualify for the Korn Ferry Tour Championship presented by Virginia's Richmond Region at The Federal Club in Glen Allen, Virginia. Those 60 players will also earn full status for the 2027 Korn Ferry Tour Season.
