Zack Fischer (1st/-13)

- Plays his final four holes at 5-under with three birdies (Nos. 15, 16, 18) and an eagle on the par-5 17th en route to an 8-under 62, marking the lowest round of his career (previous low: 63/five occurrences)
- Second 54-hole lead/co-lead of his Korn Ferry Tour career; 0-for-1 in converting to victories (T1/2022 The Panama Championship/finished T5)
- Bidding for first Korn Ferry Tour victory in his 171st start (best finish: third/2016 WinCo Foods Portland Open presented by KraftHeinz)
- Began the 2026 campaign with conditional membership following a No. 84 finish on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List
- After a No. 111 finish on the 2023 Korn Ferry Tour Points List, he competed on PGA TOUR Americas for the 2024 season, where he finished No. 61 on the points list
- Earned a return to the Korn Ferry Tour for the 2025 season by virtue of his T36 finish at Final Stage of 2024 PGA TOUR Q-School presented by Korn Ferry
- In seven seasons on the Korn Ferry Tour, his best finish on the Points List was No. 36 (2022)
- Earned medalist honors at 2013 Korn Ferry Tour Qualifying Tournament (now PGA TOUR Q-School presented by Korn Ferry) to earn Korn Ferry Tour membership for the first time; would later become the first two-time medalist in 2021, regaining Korn Ferry Tour membership for the 2022 season
- Only PGA TOUR-sanctioned win came at the 116th Visa Argentina Open presented by Macro on PGA TOUR Latinoamérica, his only start on the circuit
- Texarkana, Texas native who played collegiately at the University of Texas-Arlington

Additional Notes

- Nine of the 13 Korn Ferry Tour events this season have been won by the 54-hole leader/co-leader

- Of the 13 players who stand T14 or better, only **Alvaro Ortiz** (2026 UNC Health Championship) and **Andrew Kozan** (2022 Utah Championship presented by Zions Bank and Intermountain Health) have won on the Korn Ferry Tour
- **Ryo Ishikawa** (T2/-9), who is credited with 20 career wins on the Japan Golf Tour, establishes a new 54-hole high position (previous 54-hole high position: T8/2026 Visit Knoxville Open/finished T15)
- **Ben Carr** (T4/-8), who held the 18-hole solo lead, stands inside the top five after 54 holes for the first time in his career on Tour (previous 54-hole high position: T11/2026 Tulum Championship at PGA Riviera Maya/finished eighth)
- Sponsor exemption Wyatt Provence (T6/-7), who is an Amarillo, Texas native, cards a 7-under 63 with nine birdies (Nos. 3, 4, 5, 6, 8, 11, 15, 16, 17) against two bogeys (Nos. 2, 13)
- Three members of the PGA TOUR University Class of 2026 stand inside the top-10 in their professional debuts: **Tommy Morrison** (T6/-7), **William Sides** (T6/-7), and **Jase Summy** (T6/-7)
 - Players who finished Nos. 2 – 10 in the PGA TOUR University Class of 2026 earned membership for the remainder of the 2026 Korn Ferry Tour season: Summy (No. 3, Oklahoma), Morrison (No. 6, Texas), and Sides (No. 7, SMU)
- 36-hole leader **Chan Kim** (T14/-6) posts a 3-over 73 in the third round
- Carson Young was assessed a one-stroke penalty for a Bad Time in accordance with the Korn Ferry Tour Pace of Play Policy; Young took 75 seconds to play his second stroke on the 14th hole
 - After being tested in 2025, a revised policy was implemented on the Korn Ferry Tour for the 2026 season that assesses a one-stroke penalty for a player's first Bad Time
