Robby Shelton (1st/-11)

- First-round leader continues to pace the field through 36 holes, following a 2-under 69 with two birdies and an eagle against two bogeys
- Four-time Korn Ferry Tour winner opened the tournament with a bogey-free 9-under 62, matching the 18-hole tournament scoring record (eighth occurrence)
- Winner of the 2022 Pinnacle Bank Championship presented by Woodhouse is making his fourth career start at the event; finished solo-third at the tournament in 2025
- Holds third 36-hole lead/co-lead of his Korn Ferry Tour career in what is his 112th start; finished runner-up on both previous occasions (runner-up/2019 Robert Trent Jones Golf Trail Championship; T2/2018 BMW Charity Pro-Am)
- Earned full status for the 2026 Korn Ferry Tour Season with a No. 40 finish on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List
- Two-time Korn Ferry Tour graduate who earned PGA TOUR membership with multi-win Korn Ferry Tour seasons in 2019 and 2022
- Following a No. 87 finish in the 2023 FedExCup Fall standings, finished No. 141 in the 2024 FedExCup Fall standings, leaving him with conditional PGA TOUR status for the 2025 season
- Previously qualified for the 2020 FedExCup Playoffs as a PGA TOUR rookie, finishing No. 66 in the 2019-20 FedExCup standings

- Finished No. 2 in the 2017 Fortinet Cup standings on PGA TOUR Canada to earn Korn Ferry Tour membership for the 2018 season
- Played three seasons at University of Alabama (2013-16), garnering three consecutive All-America First Team honors and breaking Justin Thomas' school record with seven career victories

Additional Notes

- Korn Ferry Tour winner **Thomas Rosenmueller** (T2/-10), a class of 2024 Korn Ferry Tour graduate, cards a bogey-free 6-under 65 and stands inside the top five through 36 holes for the second time this season (T1/Evans Scholars Invitational/finished T25)
- **Nick Gabrelcik** (T2/-10), who finished T8 at the 2025 Pinnacle Bank Championship, establishes a new 36-hole high position (previous: T3/2025 UNC Health Championship/finished T34)
- **Alistair Docherty** (T2/-10), who stands No. 7 on the 2026 Korn Ferry Tour Points List, stands inside the top five through 36 holes for the first time since he held the 36-hole co-lead at the 119th VISA Argentina Open presented by Macro, which he went on to win for his first Korn Ferry Tour victory
- **William Sides** (T2/-10), who finished No. 7 in the 2026 PGA TOUR University Ranking, cards a bogey-free 6-under 65, matching his career low (third occurrence) and logging a new 36-hole high position (previous 36-hole high: T20/OccuNet Classic/finished T14)
- Rookie **John Marshall Butler** (T2/-10), who finished No. 7 on the 2025 PGA TOUR Americas Points List, establishes a new 36-hole high position and stands inside the top five after two rounds for the second time this season (previous: T4/Visit Knoxville Open/finished T3)
- **Michael Johnson** (T7/-9), who stands No. 11 on the 2026 Korn Ferry Tour Points List, made six birdies on the day, but dropped two strokes with a double bogey on the par-4 16th en route to a 4-under 67; stands inside the top 10 after 36 holes for the fourth time this season (4th/Memorial Health Championship/finished T7; T4/Visit Knoxville Open/finished T12; T8/The Bahamas Golf Classic/finished T16)
- Of the eight open qualifiers, George Kneiser (T65/-2) was the only one to advance to the weekend, making the 36-hole cut on the number
