Frankie Harris (1st/-22)

- Defeats Alistair Docherty with a par on the second hole of a sudden-death playoff (No. 18) to win the 2026 Pinnacle Bank Championship presented by Woodhouse for his first career victory in his sixth start
- Carded a final-round bogey-free 12-under 59 with 10 birdies and an eagle, marking the 18th sub-60 round in Korn Ferry Tour history (last: Chris Francour/59/2026 Utah Championship/Round 2)
 - Posted an 8-under 27 on the back nine, tying the Korn Ferry Tour record for the lowest 9-hole score with the 13th 9-hole score of 27 in Tour history (most recent: Julian Suri/2025 Albertsons Boise Open presented by Chevron/Round 1)
 - Becomes the fourth player in Tour history to record a sub-60 round and go on to win the tournament; first player to record a sub-60 score in the final round and win
- Breaks the 72-hole tournament scoring record – along with Docherty – at 22-under 262 (previous 72-hole tournament scoring record: 263/Sam Ryder/2017)
- Becomes the sixth player to win on Tour in the same season they earned membership via PGA TOUR University performance benefits
 - Pierceson Coody | No. 1 in 2022 PGA TOUR University Ranking, won 2022 Live and Work in Maine Open

- Adrien Dumont de Chassart | No. 3 in 2023 PGA TOUR University Ranking, won 2023 BMW Charity Pro-Am presented by TD SYNEX
- Ricky Castillo | No. 9 in 2023 PGA TOUR University Ranking, won 2023 Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Kansas Wichita Open
- Karl Vilips | No. 10 in 2024 PGA TOUR University Ranking, won 2024 Utah Championship presented by Zions Bank and Intermountain Health
- Tommy Morrison | No. 6 in 2026 PGA TOUR University Ranking, won 2026 Evans Scholars Invitational
- Finished No. 9 in the PGA TOUR University Class of 2026, granting him Korn Ferry Tour membership for the remainder of the 2026 season
- Played three seasons at the University of South Carolina (2023-26) after transferring from Auburn University, where he spent two seasons (2021-23)
- In three seasons at the University of South Carolina, earned five individual victories (and was credited with a sixth win as a co-medalist) and garnered a 2026 All-America Second Team honor

Additional Notes

- Marks the first playoff in 10 iterations of the Pinnacle Bank Championship presented by Woodhouse
- Korn Ferry Tour winner **Alistair Docherty** (2nd/-22), who stands No. 4 on the 2026 Korn Ferry Tour Points List, made the turn at even-par on the day, then birdied seven of nine holes on the back nine, including his final four holes for a 7-under 64 to force a playoff with Harris
- Docherty's runner-up finish marks his second of the season (T2/The Bahamas Great Abaco Classic at The Abaco Club) and his best result since his victory at the 119th Visa Argentina Open presented by Macro in February
- Four-time Korn Ferry Tour winner **Robby Shelton** (3rd/-19), who won the 2022 Pinnacle Bank Championship, records his first top-five finish on Tour since last season's iteration of the Pinnacle Bank Championship, when he also finished solo third
- **Doc Redman** (4th/-18), a two-time winner in the 2026 season, reclaims the No. 1 spot on the 2026 Korn Ferry Tour Points List from Ian Holt, who had overtaken Redman for the top spot after the Utah Championship
- **Will Chandler** (5th/-17), who stands No. 46 on the 2026 Korn Ferry Tour Points List, cards a 7-under 64 to record the second-best result of his Korn Ferry Tour career (best: T2/2024 Magnit Championship)
- **William Sides** (8th/-15), who finished No. 7 in the PGA TOUR University Class of 2026, logs his best finish on Tour in his sixth career start (previous best: T10/OccuNet Classic presented by Amarillo National Bank)
- **Brett Stegmaier** (T9/-14) cards a bogey-free 5-under 66 in the final round and earns a start at next week's Albertsons Boise Open presented by Chevron with his top-10 finish
