**Dylan Menante (T1/-15)**

- Second-year Korn Ferry Tour member cards a bogey-free 7-under 65 to claim the first 36-hole lead/co-lead of his Korn Ferry Tour career in what is his 23rd start (previous best 36-hole position: T8/Evans Scholar Invitational/finished T24)
- Finished No. 53 on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List – securing full status for the 2026 Korn Ferry Tour season – off the strength of seven top-25 finishes and a top 10 (T3/Visit Knoxville Open)
- Making first career start at The Bahamas Golf Classic at Atlantis Paradise Island
- Began the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour season with conditional membership via Final Stage of 2024 PGA TOUR Q-School presented by Korn Ferry
- Made 10 starts during the 2024 PGA TOUR Americas season, logging four top-25 finishes and a top 10 (T7/Explore NB Open) en route to a No. 70 finish on the points list
- Finished No. 15 in the PGA TOUR University Class of 2024 to earn PGA TOUR Americas membership for the 2024 season, following three seasons at Pepperdine University (2019-22) and two at the University of North Carolina (2022-24), where he completed his collegiate career

**Taylor Dickson (T1/-15)**

- Made three eagles (Nos. 4, 7, 9) in the second round en route to a career-low 10-under 62 (previous low: 63/two instances)
  - Becomes the 44th player in Korn Ferry Tour history to record three eagles in a round (last: Dalton Ward/2025 Albertsons Boise Open presented by Chevron/Round 1)
- Making his 100th start on the Korn Ferry Tour and fourth at The Bahamas Golf Classic at Atlantis Paradise Island (best finish: T39/2020)
- Second 36-hole lead/co-lead of his Korn Ferry Tour career (won/2024 Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Kansas Wichita Open)
- Class of 2024 Korn Ferry Tour graduate, collected two wins (Astara Chile Classic presented by Scotia Bank, Wichita Open) and three additional top-10 finishes en route to a No. 6 finish on the 2024 Korn Ferry Tour Points List to earn his first PGA TOUR card (top 30)
- Made 26 starts during the 2025 PGA TOUR season, highlighted by a T4 finish at the Zurich Classic of New Orleans with partner Trace Crowe; finished No. 174 in the FedExCup Fall
- Turned professional in 2015 after playing four seasons collegiately at Winthrop University (2011-15) where he won one individual title

#### **Roger Sloan (T1/-15)**

- Three-time Korn Ferry Tour graduate (2014, 2018, 2023) posts a bogey-free 7-under and remains bogey-free through the first 36 holes; one of nine players bogey-free after 36 holes
- Makes second cut in fourth career start at The Bahamas Golf Classic at Atlantis Paradise Island (T31/2023)
- 1-for-2 in converting 36-hole leads/co-leads into wins in his Korn Ferry Tour career (2014 Nova Scotia Open/won, 2014 Visit Knoxville/T30)
- Finished No. 131 on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List after 14 made cuts in 21 starts with one top-25 finish (T25/LECOM Suncoast Classic)
- Two-time Korn Ferry Tour winner, most recently winning the 2023 Utah Championship presented by Zions Bank and Intermountain Health en route to earning a return to the PGA TOUR with a No. 29 finish on the 2023 Korn Ferry Tour Points List (top 30)
- Owns 155 career starts on the PGA TOUR with 21 top-25 finishes and five top 10s, including two runners-up (T2/2021 Wyndham Championship, T2/2019 Puerto Rico Open)

#### **Additional Player Notes**

- Korn Ferry Tour winner **Bryson Nimmer** (4th/-14), who finished No. 47 on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List, matches his career low with an 8-under 64 (fourth occurrence; last: 2024 Evans Scholar Invitational/Round 3)
- **James Nicholas** (T5/-13), who finished No. 64 on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List, matches the best 36-hole position of his career on Tour (T5/Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Kansas Wichita Open/finished T34)
- **Tyler Leach** (T8/-12), in his first PGA TOUR-sanctioned start, made a hole-in-one on the 164-yard par-3 12th with an 8-iron in the first round
  - Leach – who was one of five players who advanced through each stage of 2025 PGA TOUR Q-School presented by Korn Ferry, beginning with Pre-Qualifying – posts a bogey-free 4-under 68 in the second round
- Bahamian **Cameron Riley** (T107/-3), a Freeport native who played collegiately at Florida A&M (2016-21), recorded a 2-under 70 in the second round
