Mason Andersen (T1/-20)

- Cards a bogey-free 9-under 63 and is bidding for his second career Korn Ferry Tour title
- Second 54-hole/co-lead of his Korn Ferry Tour career in what is his 52nd start (2023 Astra Chile Classic Presented by Scotiabank/finished T7)
- Making third start at The Bahamas Golf Classic at Atlantis Paradise Island (best finish: T7/2024)
- Made 25 starts during the 2025 PGA TOUR season with nine made cuts (best finish: T22/Butterfield Bermuda Championship)
- Class of 2024 Korn Ferry Tour graduate (top 30); finished No. 22 on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List off the strength of his first career victory at the 117 Visa Argentina Open presented by Macro, defeating Kris Ventura with a birdie on the second hole (No. 18) of a sudden-death playoff
- Previously, finished No. 36 on the 2023 Korn Ferry Tour Points List, earning fully exempt status for the 2024 Korn Ferry Tour Season
- Turned professional in 2022 following five seasons at Arizona State University (2018-22), where he earned All-America Third Team honors (2022) and was an All-Pac-12 Conference First Team selection (2019)

Taylor Dickson (T1/-20)

- Second round co-leader continues to hold a share of the 54-hole lead after a bogey-free 5-under 67; bogey-free through the first three rounds of play
- Made three eagles (Nos. 4, 7, 9) in the second round en route to a career-low 10-under 62 (previous low: 63/two instances)
 - The 44th player in Korn Ferry Tour history to record three eagles in a round (last: Dalton Ward/2025 Albertsons Boise Open presented by Chevron/Round 1)
- Making his 100th start on the Korn Ferry Tour and fourth at The Bahamas Golf Classic at Atlantis Paradise Island (best finish: T39/2020)
- Eyeing third career Korn Ferry Tour victory
- Class of 2024 Korn Ferry Tour graduate, collected two wins (Astara Chile Classic presented by Scotia Bank, Wichita Open) and three additional top-10 finishes en route to a No. 6 finish on the 2024 Korn Ferry Tour Points List to earn his first PGA TOUR card (top 30)
- Made 26 starts during the 2025 PGA TOUR season, highlighted by a T4 finish at the Zurich Classic of New Orleans with partner Trace Crowe; finished No. 174 in the FedExCup Fall
- Turned professional in 2015 after playing four seasons collegiately at Winthrop University (2011-15) where he won one individual title

Additional Player Notes

- **Michael Johnson** (T3/-19) – who finished No. 48 on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List and is making his 167th career start on the Korn Ferry Tour – recorded a bogey-free 7-under 65 and has not recorded a bogey in this event
 - In search of his first career Korn Ferry Tour win, Johnson holds his best 54-hole position on the Korn Ferry Tour since the 2025 LECOM Suncoast Classic (T1/finished T4)
- **Hunter Eichhorn** (T3/-19), making his 13th career Korn Ferry Tour start, recorded a 7-under 65 on the day and holds his best career position through 54 holes (previous best: T5/2024 Veritex Bank Championship/finished T5)
 - In the third round, the Marquette product played in a group alongside collegiate teammate **Tyler Leach** (T55/-11) and five-time PGA TOUR winner **Camilo Villegas** (T24/-15)
- Second round co-leader **Roger Sloan** (T3/-19), who is making his 160th Korn Ferry Tour start, overcame a double-bogey on No. 2 to record a 4-under 68 and holds his best 54-hole position on Tour since the 2023 Utah Championship presented by Zions Bank and Intermountain Health (T2/Won)
 - Sloan – a two-time Korn Ferry Tour winner who finished No. 131 on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List – was the 10th alternate after the field entry deadline
- Second-year Korn Ferry Tour member **Dylan Menante** (T3/-19) carded a bogey-free 4-under 68 and has yet to record a bogey in the tournament
 - In search of his first career Korn Ferry Tour victory, this marks the second-best 54-hole position of his Korn Ferry Tour career as he searches for his first career victory (previous best: 2nd/2025 Visit Knoxville Open/finished T3)
