**Alvaro Ortiz (1st/-10)**

- Defeats Ross Steelman with a birdie on the first hole (No. 18) of a sudden-death playoff to capture his first Korn Ferry Tour victory in his 84th start
- Made back-to-back birdies on Nos. 17 & 18 for a 2-over 72 final round to force a playoff with Steelman
- First Korn Ferry Tour winner since Smylie Kaufman at the 2015 United Leasing & Finance Championship to record two or more double bogeys or worse in the final round; Ortiz made double bogey at the par-4 second and par-4 11th
- Earns first Korn Ferry Tour victory at 30 years, 6 months, 16 days
- In the third round, recorded the 30th hole-in-one in UNC Health Championship history on the par-3 sixth with a 2-iron from 259 yards en route to a 1-under 69
- Logged an 18-hole career low in the second round of the UNC Health Championship with an 8-under 62 (previous best: 63; three occurrences)
- Seventh player representing Mexico to win on the Korn Ferry Tour (last: Emilio Gonzalez/2025 Albertsons Boise Open presented by Chevron)
- Best finish in five previous appearances at the UNC Health Championship was T4/2024
- Finished No. 26 on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List in his third season on Tour, earning full status for the 2026 season
- Previously recorded finishes of No. 133 (2022) and No. 57 (2024) on the Korn Ferry Tour Points List

- Played two seasons on PGA TOUR Latinoamérica (2020-21; 2023), highlighted by a No. 4 finish on the 2020-21 Order of Merit, as well as a victory at the 2020 Abierto Mexicano de Golf
- Decorated amateur career included a victory at the 2019 Latin America Amateur Championship, which earned him an exemption for the 2019 Masters Tournament (finished T36 and was the second-lowest amateur, only behind Viktor Hovland, who finished T32)
- Played four seasons at University of Arkansas (2014-18), where he earned two collegiate victories

#### Additional Notes

- **Ross Steelman** (2nd/-10), who entered the final round six strokes off the lead, carded a 4-under 66 final round to force a playoff with 54-hole leader and eventual champion Alvaro Ortiz
- Steelman, who is a fourth-year Korn Ferry Tour member, establishes a new career-best finish in his 64th start on Tour (previous best finish: solo-third/2024 The Bahamas Great Golf Classic at Atlantis Paradise Island)
- Conditional member **Tyler Wilkes** (T3/-8), who earned a start at this week's UNC Health Championship by virtue of his top-25 finish at the Visit Knoxville Open (T23), records the best result of his career in his third Korn Ferry Tour start, earning a spot in next week's BMW Charity Pro-Am presented by TD SYNEX with a second consecutive top-25
- **Turk Pettit** (T5/-6) closes in 6-under 64 for the low score of the final round and logs his second top-five finish on the season in his sixth start (Colonial Life Charity Classic/T4)
- **Logan McAllister** (T5/-6), who finished No. 29 on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List, logs his second top-10 finish of the season (other: The Bahamas Great Golf Classic/T6) and first top five since his win at the 2025 Astara Chile Classic presented by Scotiabank
- **Cooper Dossey** (T7/-5) records a second consecutive top-10 finish (T3/Visit Knoxville Open) and his fifth of the 2026 season; only Ian Gilligan and Hunter Eichhorn have more top-10s with six
- **Zak Fischer** (T7/-5), who made his eighth career start at the UNC Health Championship this week, notched his first top-10 finish on Tour since his T10 at the 2023 Veritex Bank Championship
